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

## **Patient Education: Are Our Patients Really Learning?**

There are some days we all feel like a broken record, saying the same things over and over to our patients. We may wonder if they are really receiving the information we are trying to give them. Here are some tips to ensure that you are indeed educating your patients.

- "Teach Back" To help make sure your patients are truly understanding what you are trying to tell them, try asking your patients to tell you what they learned. Remember- this isn't a test, if they are unable to tell you, then you need to explain the concept again.
- "Chunk and Check" Don't wait until the appointment is over, give small bits of information and ask your patient to teach it back to you.
- "Show-me" When teaching an Oral Hygiene technique, don't just show your patients, have them show you what they learned.
- Brochures-Utilize your brochures and personalize the information for your patients, also allow your patients to use the pictures in the brochures while they "Teach Back" but try to encourage them to use their own words.
