Clinical Medical Assistants (CMA) are frontline workers trained to perform various clinical tasks such as patient intake, medication administration, minor procedures, electrocardiograms (EKG), and other related duties. They also serve as the hub of an effective clinical care team by providing excellent patient care and team leadership. The United States Bureau of Labor has projected the CMA field to grow 29% by the year 2022.

CMA training can be the first steps to health careers, such as:

- Registered Nurse (RN)
- Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN)
- Clinic Office Manager
- Medical Phlebotomist
- Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN)
- Physician Assistant (PA)
- Medical Coding
- Medical Records
- Medical Scribes

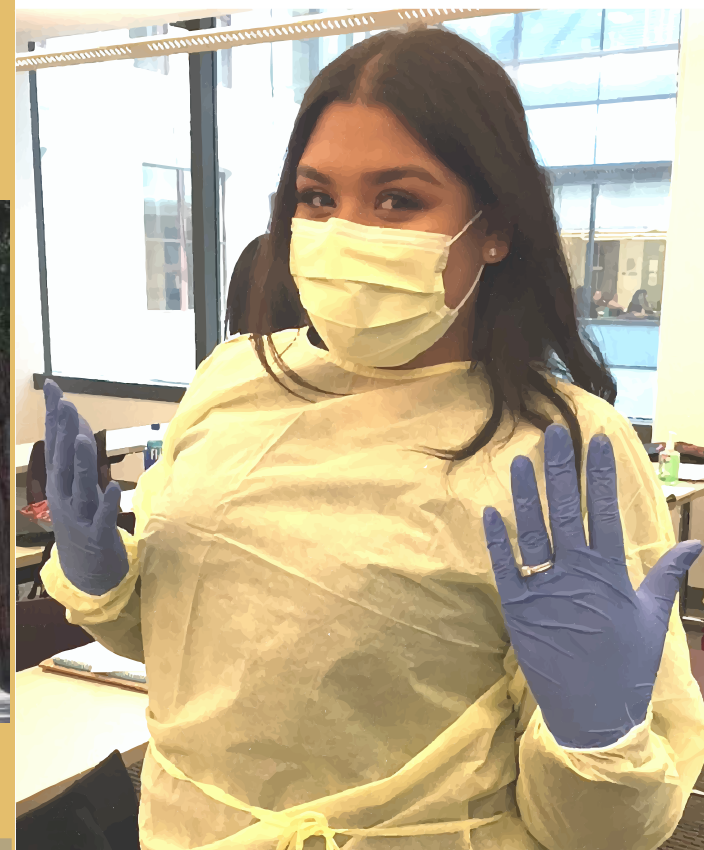

About the Program

The purpose of the Clinical Medical Assistant (CMA) Training Program is to prepare students to assist medical providers by performing clinical functions. This program covers key areas and topics such as clinical responsibilities, patient examination and treatment preparation, point-of-care testing, and proper techniques required to collect laboratory specimens.

Program Structure

- Four-month self-paced hybrid program (online and in-person) through San Francisco State University's College of Extended Learning
- Monthly clinical skills lab held on Saturdays at CRIHB in Roseville, CA
- Preparation for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) certification exam
- 160 hour externship placement in a local health facility
- Gain professional development through monthly topic-specific webinars
- Scholarships are available to support tuition, books, travel, and exam fees

- Your vaccinations are current and your most recent PPD test is negative
