## Background: Stats

• As of 3/23/20 at 2 pm PST

- 472: 3/17/20 1,955 Total positive cases
  - 24 cases of positive tests related to federal repatriation flights
  - 1,931 cases not related to repatriation flights
    - 92 travel-related
    - 31 person to person (healthcare worker)
    - 152 person to person (other close contact)
    - 531 community acquired
    - 1,094 under investigation/unknown sources
    - 31 Grand Princess (second voyage)

- 6: 3/17/20 35 deaths (13 in Santa Clara County)
  - 62 labs are reporting testing results via ELR: 17 public health labs, 16 non-public health labs, and 29 labs are reporting reference to lab results
  - 42 Federally recognized Tribes declared state of emergencies
  - Any confirmed cases on Tribal lands? CAO IHS reported 3 to IHS HQ.

## State Response

- CalOES Statewide Tribal Assistance Coordination Group (TAC-G) call: Mondays and Fridays
- Request by Gov. Newsom to President Trump for a Major disaster declaration was approved this week.
  - If you plan on applying as a sub-recipient to California, Tribes still need to submit copy of emergency declaration
- CRIHB requested meetings with CDPH Director and CalOES Director
- Coordinate with your regional MHOAC for supplies

## Federal Response

- IHS Tribal Consultation COVID-19 Funding Call on March 23, 2020
  - 3/20: CDC announced 80 million in funding to Tribes, Tribal Organizations, and Urban Indian Organizations



- Supplement an existing CoAg to 9 regionally designated Tribal Organizations, including resources for sub-awards to Tribes with the greatest burden and needs in their region and other direct funds to a number of large Tribes.
- Supplement existing funding to the NCUIH, which will make sub-awards to 41 urban Indian health centers.
- Supplement existing funding to the NIHB for COVID-19 communication activities.
- Issue a new non-competitive grant to reach all Title I and Title V Tribes that are eligible to apply for a Federal grant.

- Families First Coronavirus Response Act: Signed on March 18 by President Trump to allocate 64 million for COVID-19 testing activities to IHS. Seeking feedback and comments from Tribes.
- DHHS Public Health Social Services Emergency Fund: 70 million will be made available to prevent and prepare for COVID-19. Can be used to purchase PPE and medical supplies, other treatment needs, transportation to higher levels of care, and temporary field needs related to response.
- 3rd stimulus funding package that is currently being contemplated by Congress. Includes 10 Billion for IHS related to COVID-19 response activities. 2 failed and voting on it.

#### DAILY HIGHLIGHTS


The total number of cases in the U.S. increased from 15,219 as reported on Friday 3/20/2020 to 33,404 reported today. The number of deaths increased from 201 to 400.

The federal government has activated the US National Guard in three of the hardest hit states -- California, Washington and New York.

Nearly half of all US cases are in New York state, making it the epicenter of the US outbreak.

California, Illinois, New York and New Jersey were already under stay at home orders over the weekend. Ohio, Louisiana and Connecticut will join them on Monday. An order goes into effect on Tuesday in Delaware.

#### COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance\*

- Total cases: 33,404
- Total deaths: 400
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 54 (50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and US Virgin Islands)
- \* Data include both confirmed and presumptive positive cases of COVID-19 reported to CDC or tested at CDC since January 21, 2020, with the exception of testing results for persons repatriated to the United States from Wuhan, China and Japan. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

### COVID-19 Emergency Response for Regional Tribally Designated Organizations

- Applicants must be able to provide management and oversight of subawards, contracts, or other funding streams to tribal nations within their service area to focus on tribes with the greatest burden and needs.
- Applicants should work with their tribal epidemiology center (TEC) on data, epidemiology, and surveillance activities when feasible.
- Applicants must be able to conduct regional planning, coordination, communication, and other COVID-19 response activities that would benefit tribes in their geographical region and service area.

CA IHS area reported cases: 3 (unsure if from Tribal lands or from Urban Indian Clinics)

#### **State Response Update**

- Gov. Newsom's request for major disaster declaration was approved
  - o If Tribes plan on applying as a sub-recipient, Tribes need to submit copy of emergency declaration.
- CRIHB has requested meetings with CDPH Director and CalOES Director
- For PPE supplies and equipment, Tribes should coordinate with regional MHOAC

QUESTION: can copies of the slide be sent?

ANSWERED: Copy of the slides, recording, and notes will be available on CRIHB website

COMMENT (Mike, Pit River): Clinics have yet to receive any products through MHOAC; instructed to go through county representative for supply requests.

FEEDBACK: Relying on the national supply stockpile to make its way to Tribes; no guarantee on supplies (no timeframe). Looking into other avenues for supplies.

QUESTION (Tule River): Not able to receive testing kits and PPE. County not able to help. Any updates on these issues? How to go about it if county is not cooperating with Tribe?

FEEDBACK: CRIHB is working on finding out other avenues to get supplies; have purchased and disseminated supplies.

- IHS Tribal Consultation- COVID-19 Funding Call
  - CDC announced \$80 million in funding for Tribes, Tribal organizations, and Urban Indian organizations
  - To supplement an existing cooperative agreement to 9 regionally designated Tribal organizations (resources to sub-awards to Tribes), existing funding to the NCUIH (will make sub-awards to 41 urban Indian health centers, and existing funding to NIHB.

  - Signed March 18 by President Trump to allocate 64 million for COVID-19 testing activities to IHS.
