Provider Relief Funding Allocation to Indian Country

On May 22, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced an additional \$100 million to the Provider Relief Fund, totaling \$500 million for the Indian Health Service (IHS) and tribal hospitals, clinics and urban Indian health centers to support the Tribal response to COVID-19. Such payments address the increasing significant need for personal protective equipment (PPE), medical equipment and increased labor and workforce.
