



# CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATIONAL REPORT #73 JUNE 24, 2020



## DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 9.13 million with more than 473,700 deaths.

The total number of cases in the U.S. increased from 2,302,288 as reported on Tuesday 6/23/2020 to 2,336,615 reported today. The number of deaths in the U.S. increased from 120,333 to 121,117.

The California Area Indian Health Service (IHS) has reported that 158 California Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program patients have tested positive for COVID-19 as of 6/22/2020.

On Wednesday 6/24/2020, Governor Newsom made a statement emphasizing the gravity of the increase in cases, and asked the public to continue to abide by social distancing guidelines, wearing masks, and help enforce restrictions in public places. He emphasized individual responsibility in preventing the spread of COVID-19, and insisted that he is prepared to revert back to more stringent guidelines if necessary to curb the increase in cases

As of 6/24/2020 California reported a dramatic increase in cases shown in the graph below.

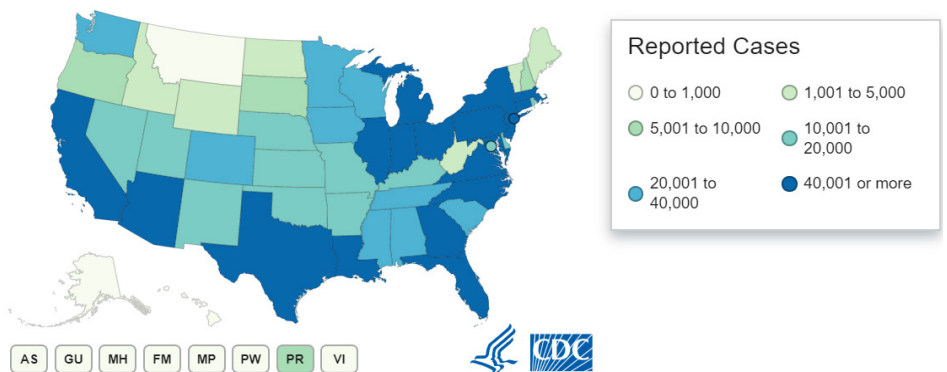
- Total cases: 2,336,615

- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 55 (50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands)

\*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020. The position statement included a case definition and made COVID-19 a nationally notifiable disease. A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:

- meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or
- meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or
- meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.

State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

## CALIFORNIA

As of June 23, 2020, there are a total of 190,222 positive cases and 5,632 deaths in California.

Ages of all confirmed positive cases:

- Age 0-17: 14,524 cases
- Age 18-49: 106,053 cases
- Age 50-64: 40,923 cases
- Age 65 and older: 28,528 cases
- Unknown/Missing: 194 cases

Gender of all confirmed positive cases:

- Female: 93,554 cases
- Male: 95,884 cases
- Unknown: 784 cases

Lab tests reported statewide: 3,592,899

Twenty-five public health labs in California are testing samples for COVID-19. These labs include the California Department of Public Health's Laboratory in Richmond, Alameda, Butte, Contra Costa, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Monterey, Napa-Solano-Yolo-Marin (located in Solano), Orange, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Shasta, Sonoma, Tulare and Ventura County public health laboratories. The Richmond Laboratory will provide diagnostic testing within a 48-hour turnaround time. This means California public health officials will get test results sooner, so that patients will get the best care.

## INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE CALIFORNIA AREA

3,711 Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program patients in the California Area have been tested for COVID-19 as of 6/22/2020.

Of these, 158 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 2,984 have tested negative for COVID-19.

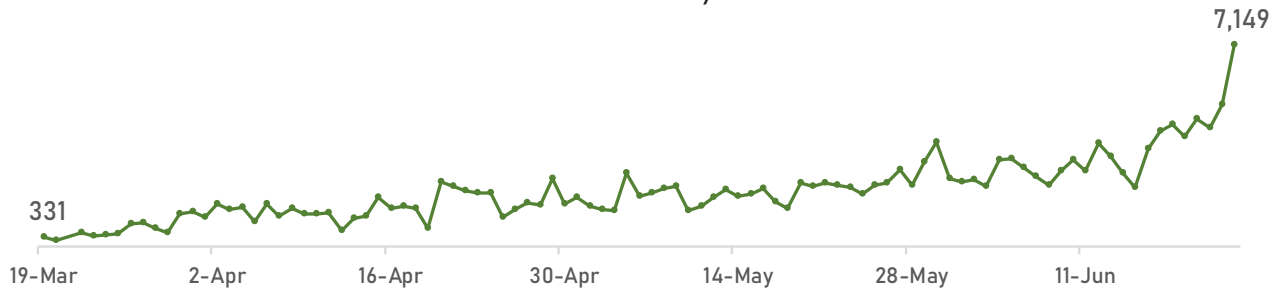

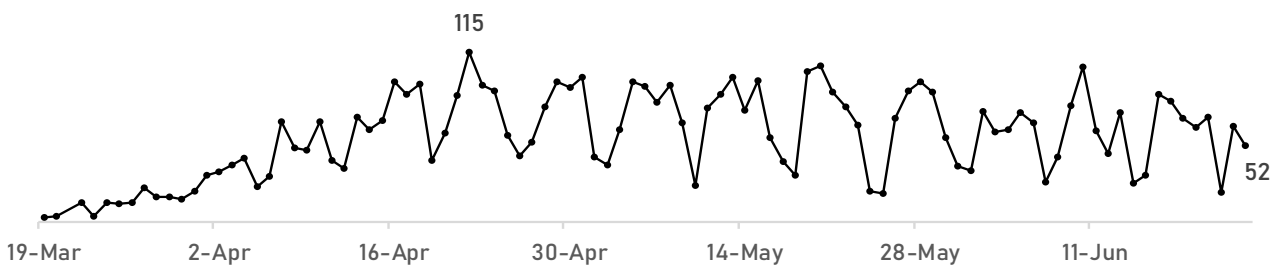

New Confirmed Cases in California by Date of Lab Confirmation



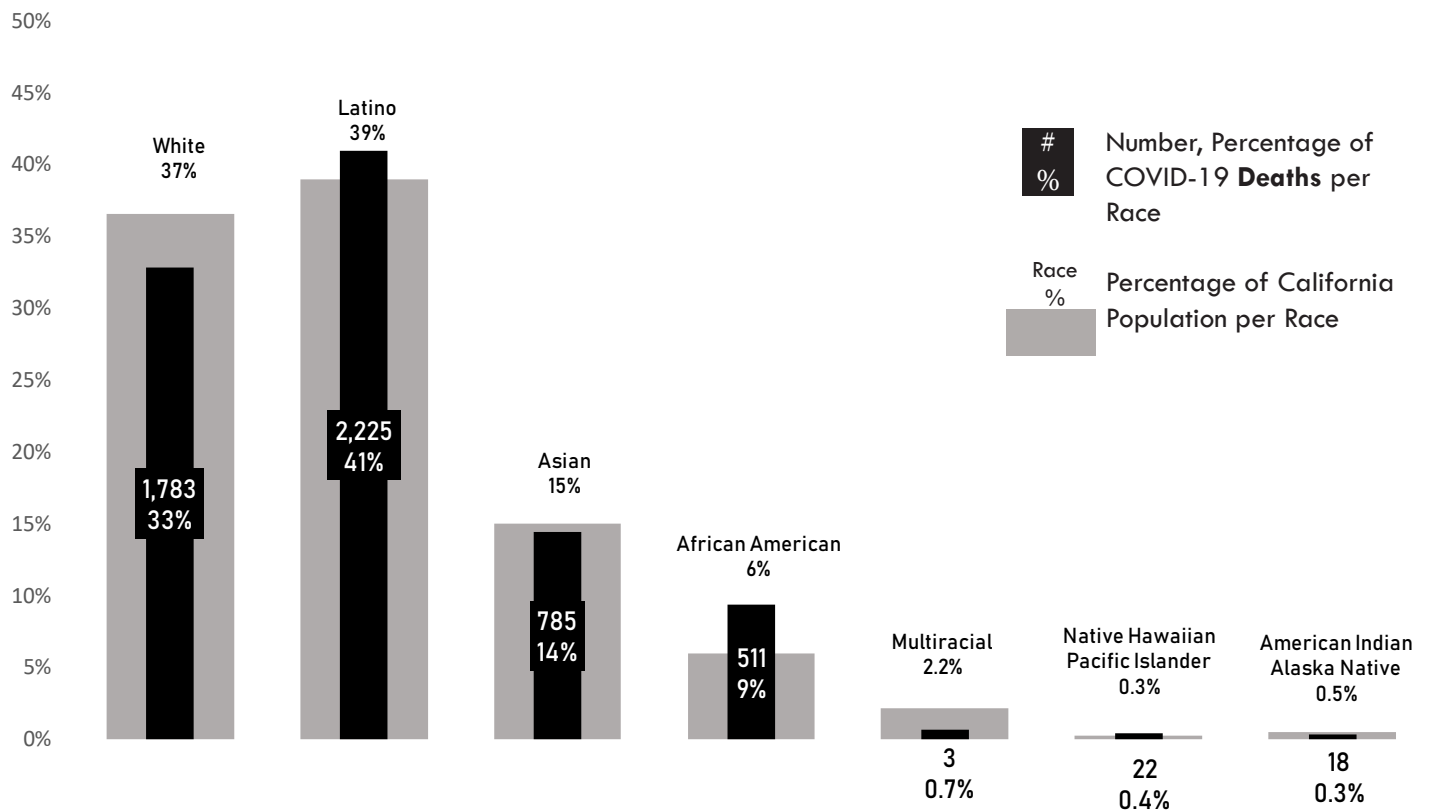
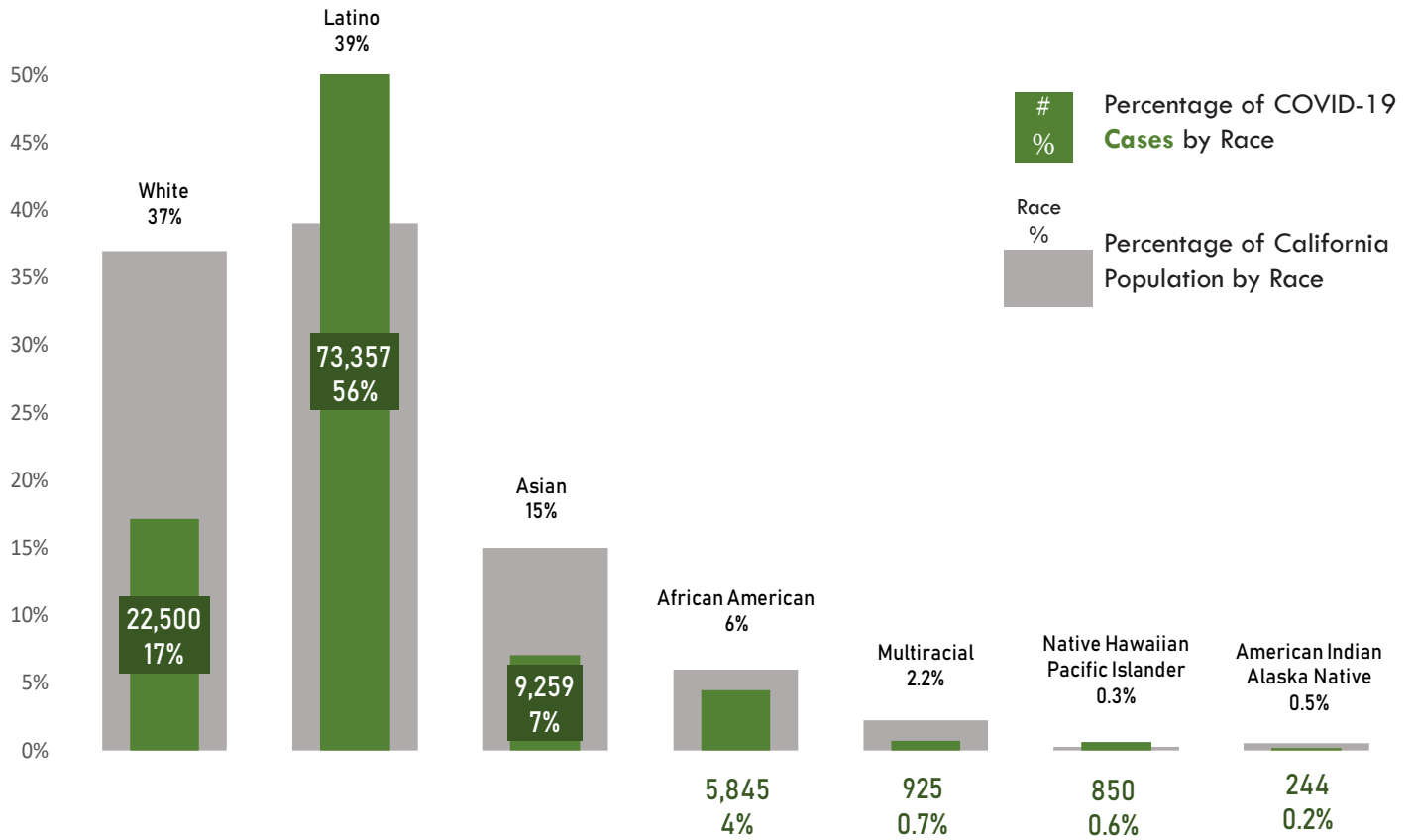
New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date

## RACIAL DISTRIBUTION OF CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN CALIFORNIA

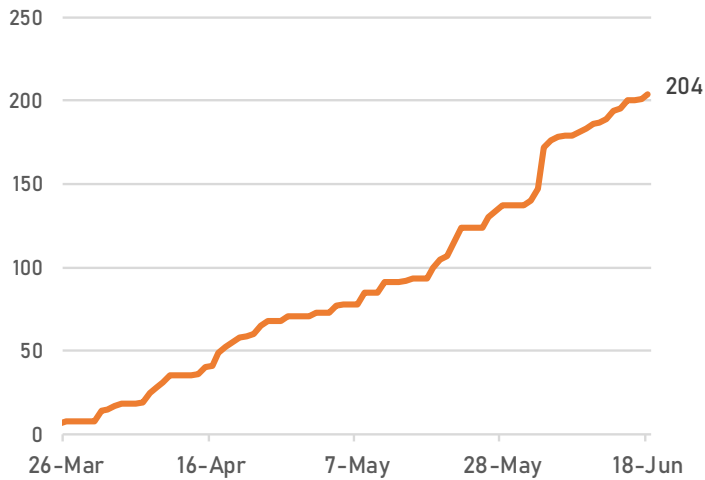
American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, **0.2% of COVID-19 cases**, and **0.3% of deaths** in California. These include **244 cases** and **18 deaths** among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.



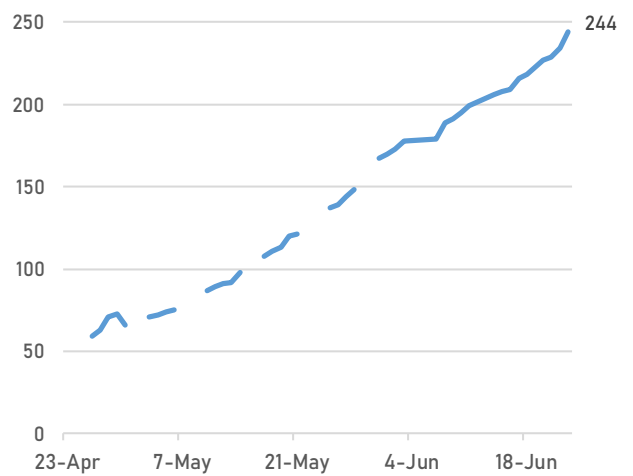

Data from the **Indian Health Service (IHS)** include positive cases reported by Tribal and Urban Indian Health Programs.

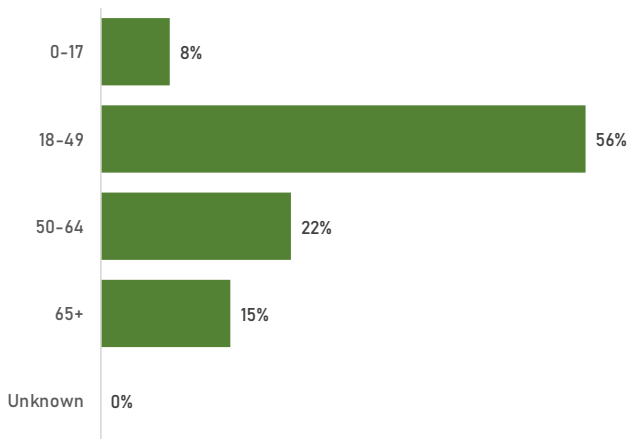


Data from **California Department of Public Health (CDPH)** include all positive cases of AIAN diagnosed in California.

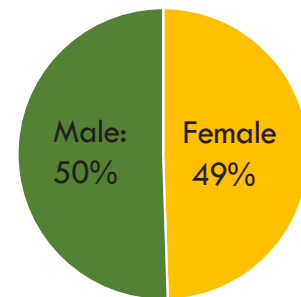

### In California:

**2.21%** of confirmed cases have been admitted to a hospital

**0.7%** of confirmed cases have been admitted to an Intensive Care Unit

**3.0%** of cases have died

### Racial disparities:

- For all adults ages 18+, Latinos and African Americans are dying at disproportionately high rates. The proportion of COVID-19 deaths in Latinos is more than 1.5 times their population representation across all adult age categories.
- Almost half of all deaths continue to be in the 80+ age category.

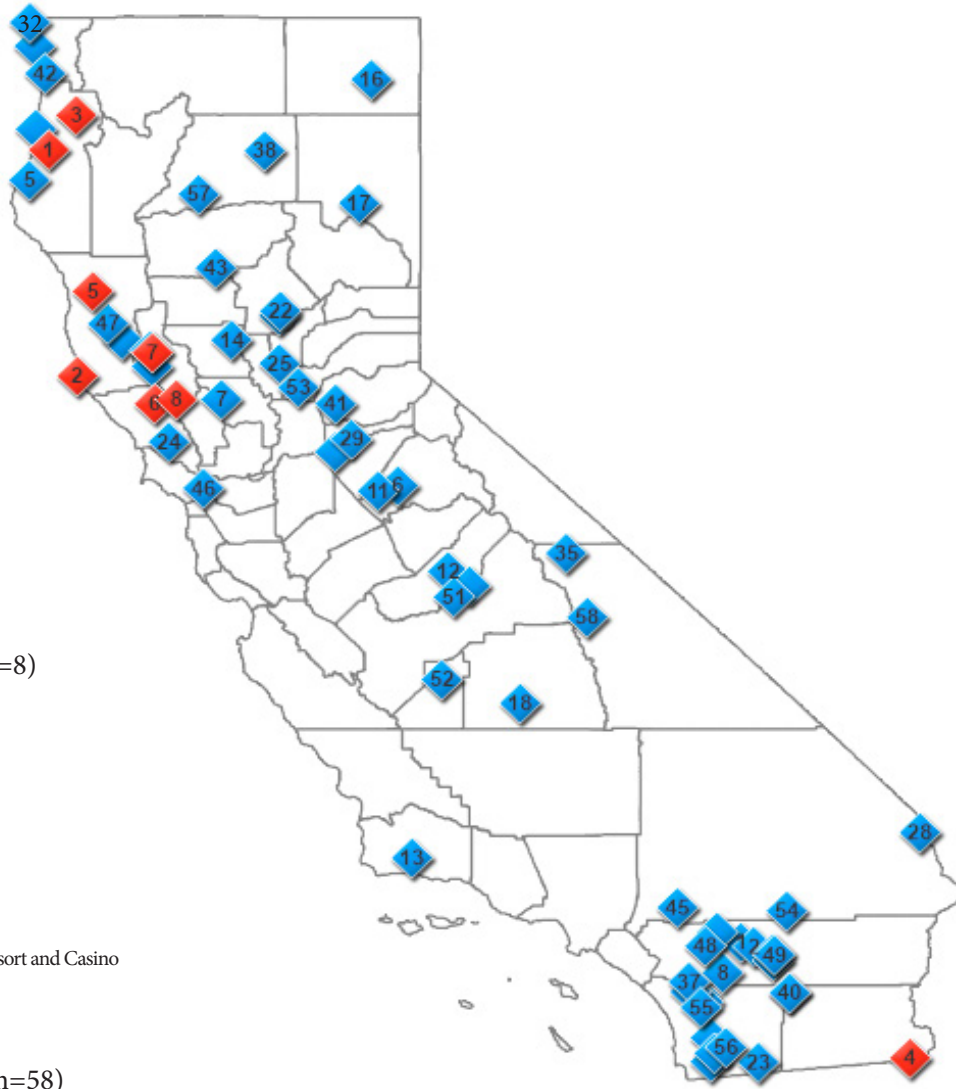

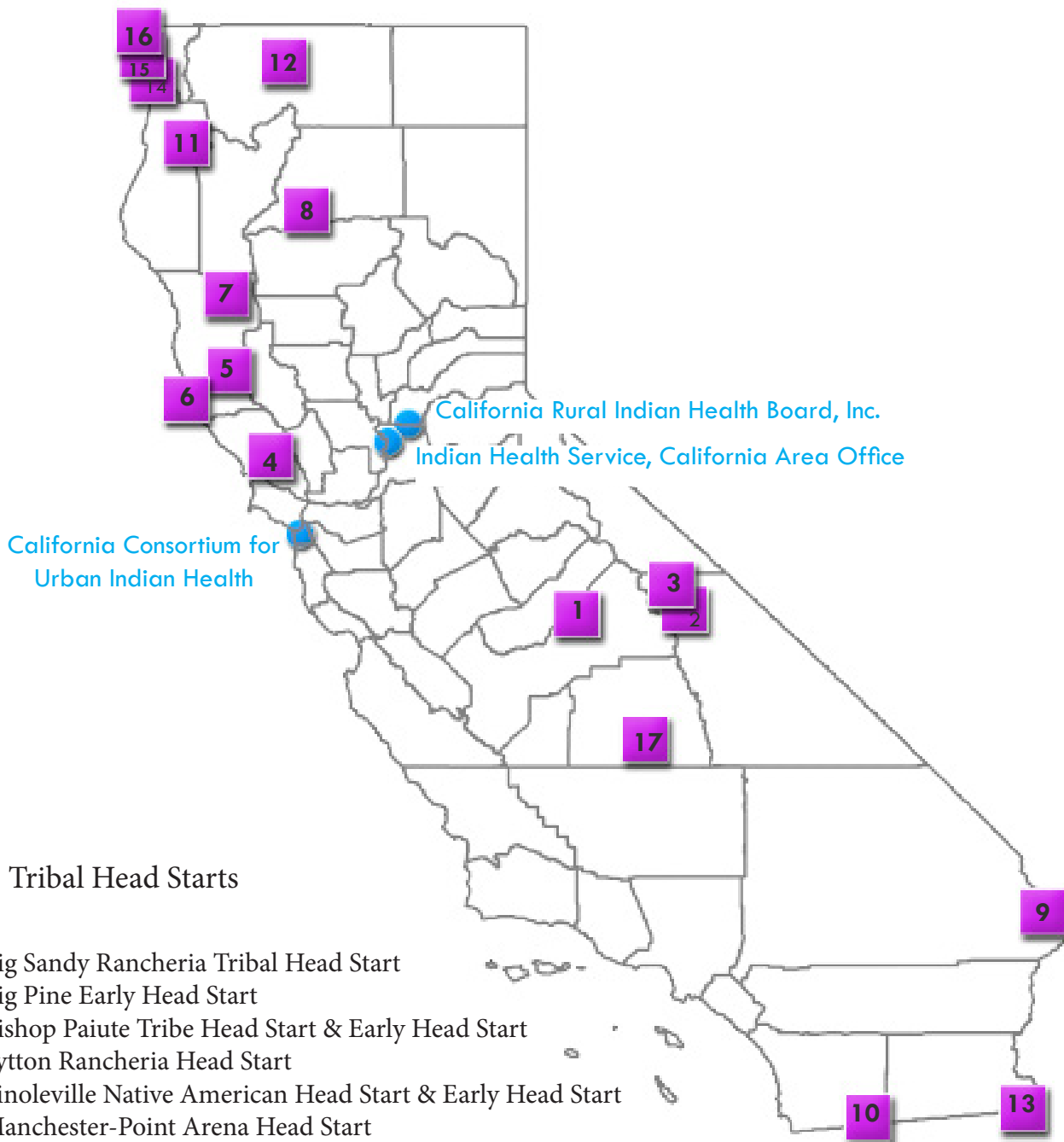

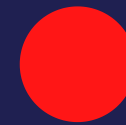
