




New Confirmed Cases in California by Date of Lab Confirmation






Two sources for tracking American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) cases reported in California








### Positive COVID-19 cases among AIAN people in California by Age Group and Gender




### Positive COVID-19 cases among AIAN people in California by Age Group and Gender


### **Provider Relief Fund Timeline**

- Phase 3- Broad Distributions (NEED TO VALIDATE TIN & SUBMIT APPLICATION)
  - If you think your might be eligible, it is worth it to enter the portal to have your Tax ID Number (TIN) validated before August 28, 2020
  - As long as you validate your TIN by 8/28/20, you can submit application later to get any remaining funds.

- 628,031 Total cases as of 08/017/2020
- 11,242 Fatalities as of 08/17/2020
- California Tribal and Urban Health Programs have self-reported 588 positive cases as of 08/15/2020
- CDC has reported 2,140 positive cases for AIAN, majority in 20-29 age range and 69 deaths, majority in 80+ age range
