

### DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 21.75 million with more than 771,000 deaths.

The total number of cases in the U.S. increased from 5,382,125 as reported on Monday 8/17/2020 to 5,422,242 reported today. The number of deaths in the U.S. increased from 169,350 to 169,870.

According to the Washington Post, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) says that the number and rate of coronavirus cases in children have risen since the pandemic took hold in the spring. They go on to state that the infection rate in children 17 and under increased “steadily” from March to July. Children between 5 and 17 years old also test positive for the novel coronavirus at higher rates than any other age group, according to CDC data, with positivity rates exceeding 10 percent in public and private lab tests. In addition, the virus incubation period is the same for children as it is for adults. Children are far less likely to develop severe symptoms, but when they are hospitalized for complications from the virus, about a third are sent to intensive care units, the same rate as adults, according to the CDC. According to an article by ABC News, the Navajo community suffered one of the highest COVID-19 infection rates per capita in the country just three months ago, but with the implementation of strict public health measures such as curfews and mandatory mask-wearing, Navajo Nation has curbed the spread of coronavirus. The latest figures from the Navajo Department of Health, in coordination with the Navajo Epidemiology Center and the Navajo Area Indian Health Service, reported 19 new COVID-19 positive cases, 6,893 recoveries and no recent deaths, according to a press release from the office of the President and Vice President of Navajo Nation. Although COVID-19 cases in the Navajo community are on the decline, precautions are still being taken to ensure that a resurgence does not occur in the next few months. \*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020. The position statement included a case definition and made COVID-19 a nationally notifiable disease.

A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

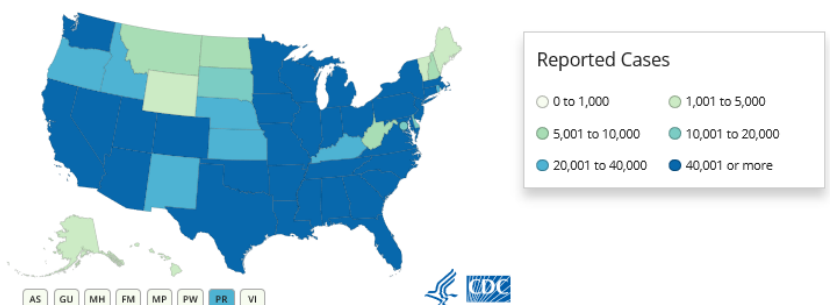
A probable case or death is defined by:

- meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.

State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

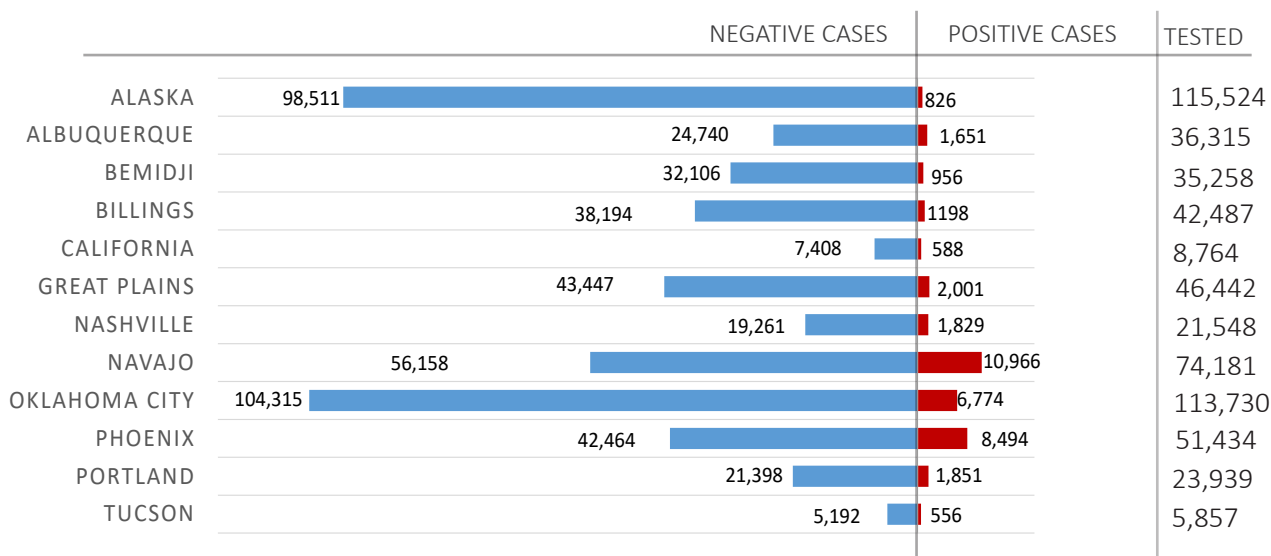

## CALIFORNIA

As of August 17, 2020, there were a total of 632,667 positive cases and 11,342 deaths in California.

Ages of all confirmed positive cases:

- Age 0-17: 62,233 cases
- Age 18-49: 380,923 cases
- Age 50-64: 120,440 cases
- Age 65 and older: 68,211 cases
- Unknown/Missing: 860 cases

Gender of all confirmed positive cases:

- Female: 317,984 cases
- Male: 307,821 cases
- Unknown: 6,862 cases

Lab tests reported statewide: 10,049,039

Twenty-five public health labs in California are testing samples for COVID-19. These labs include the California Department of Public Health's Laboratory in Richmond, Alameda, Butte, Contra Costa, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Monterey, Napa-Solano-Yolo-Marin (located in Solano), Orange, Riverside, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Shasta, Sonoma, Tulare and Ventura County public health laboratories. The Richmond Laboratory will provide diagnostic testing within a 48-hour turnaround time. This means California public health officials will get test results sooner, so that patients will get the best care.

8,764 Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program patients in the California Area have been tested for COVID-19 as of 8/16/2020.

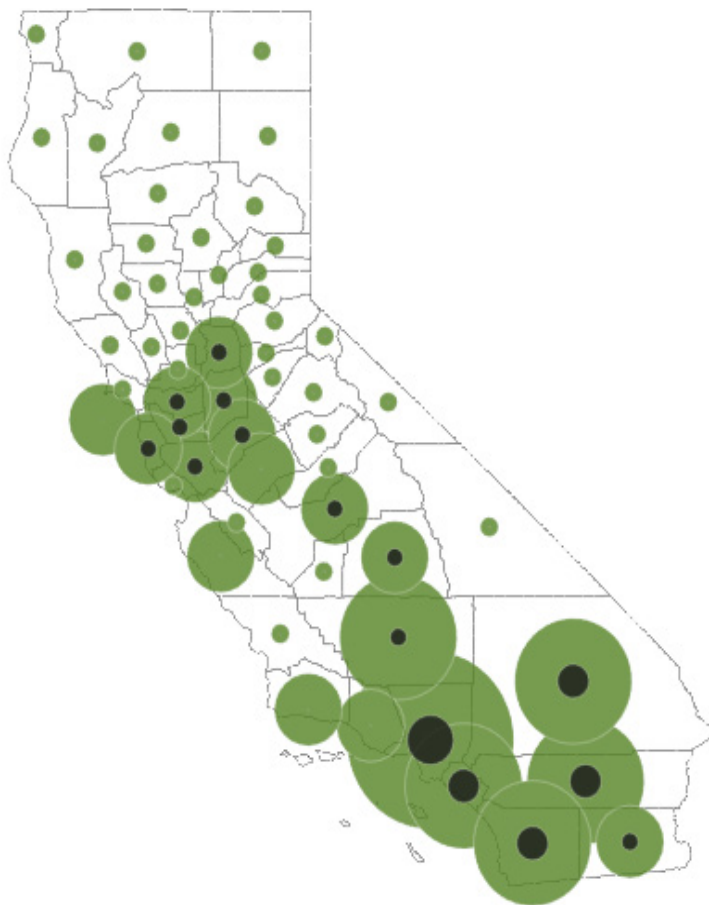
Of these, 588 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 7,408 have tested negative for COVID-19.

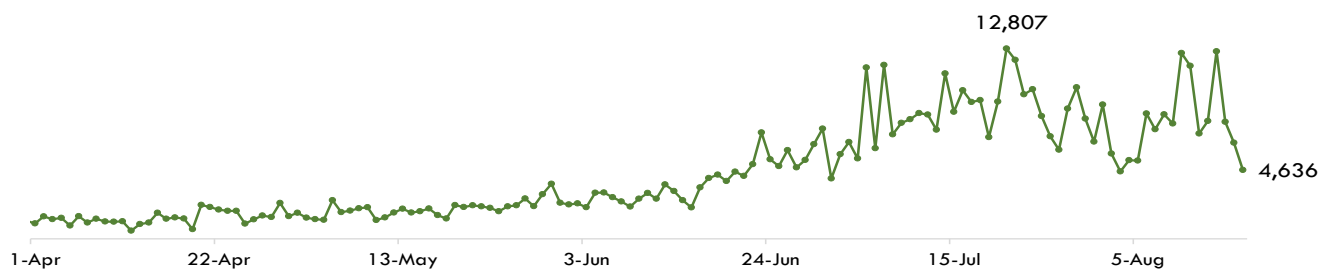

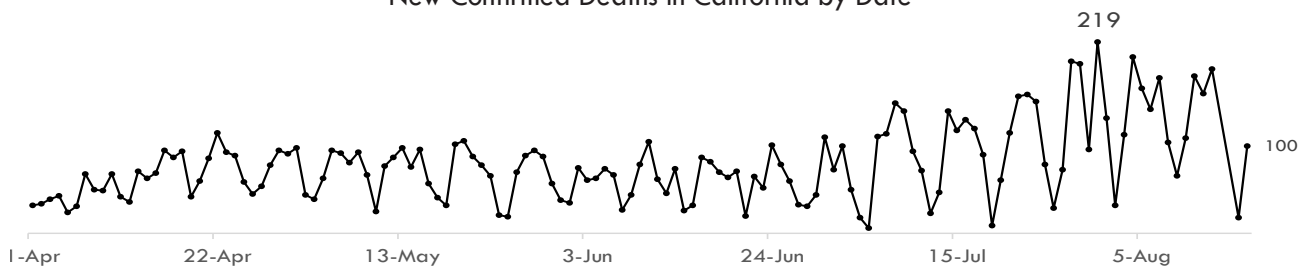

### New Confirmed Cases in California by Date of Lab Confirmation



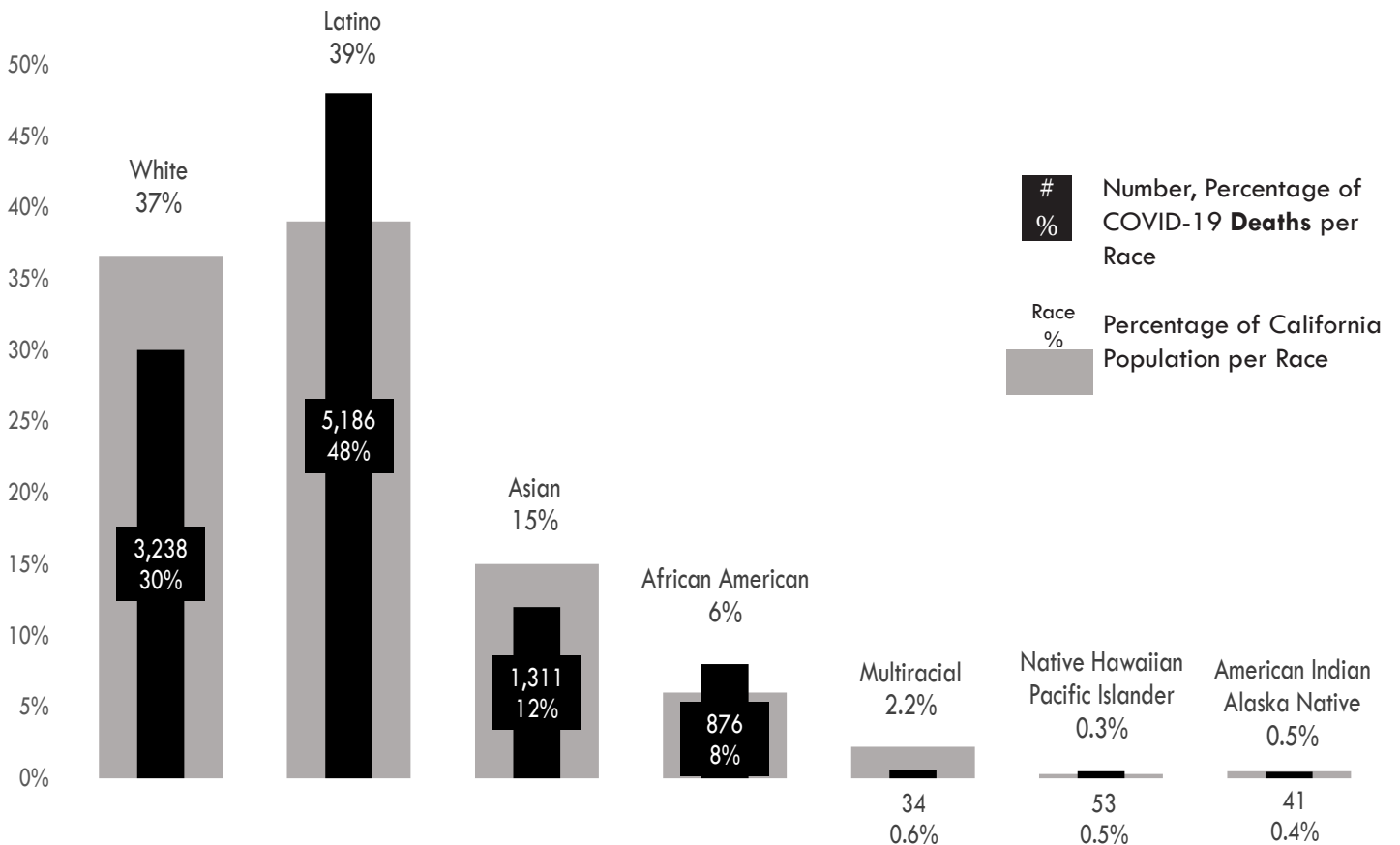
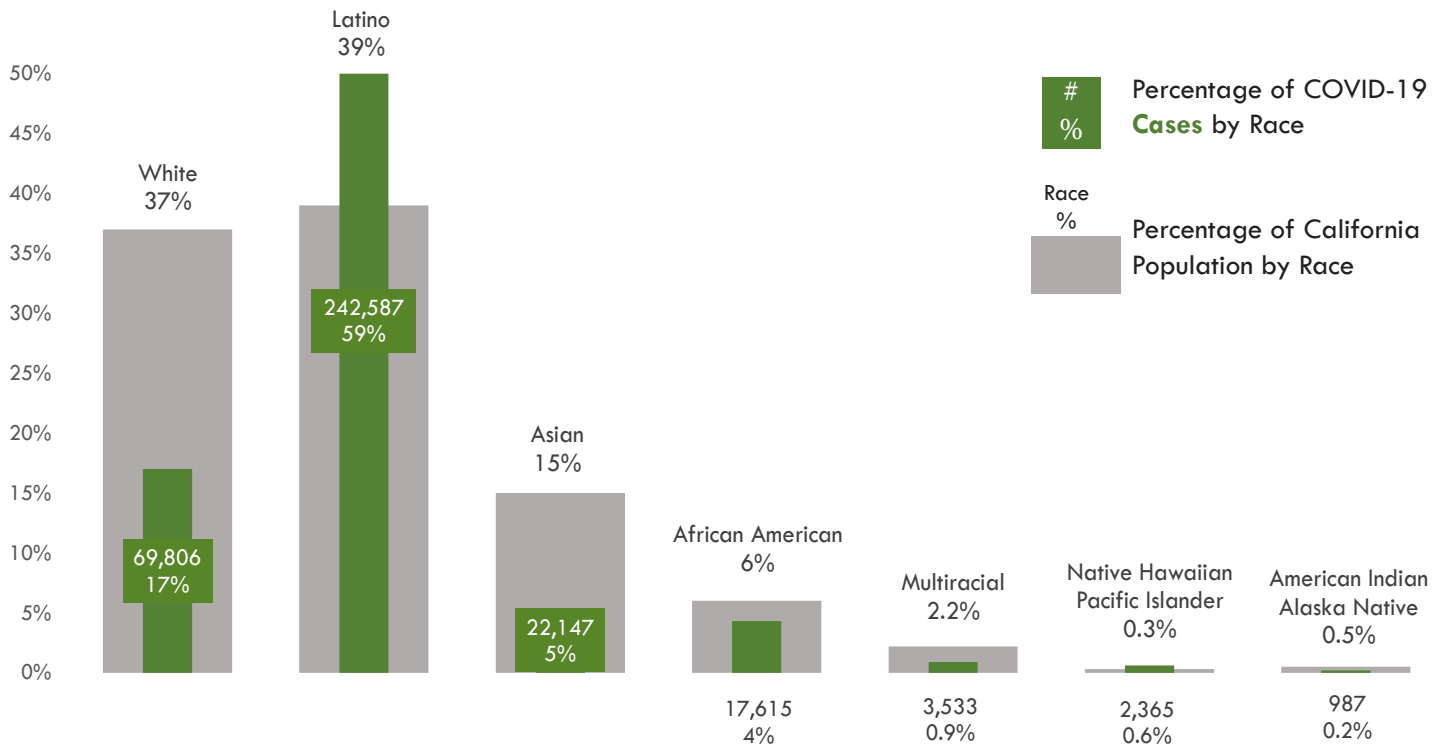
### New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date

## RACIAL DISTRIBUTION OF CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES AND DEATHS IN CALIFORNIA

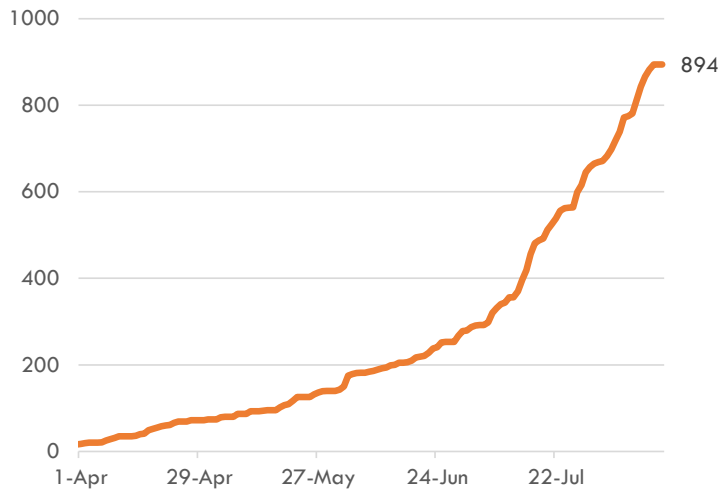

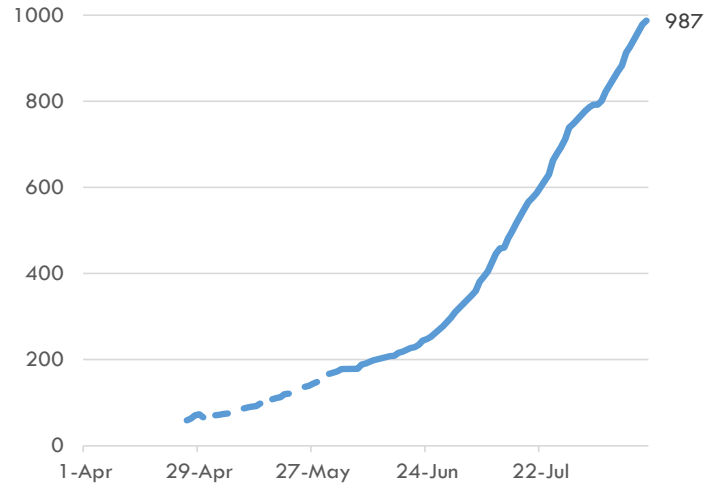

Data from the **Indian Health Service (IHS)** include positive cases reported by Tribal and Urban Indian Health Programs.

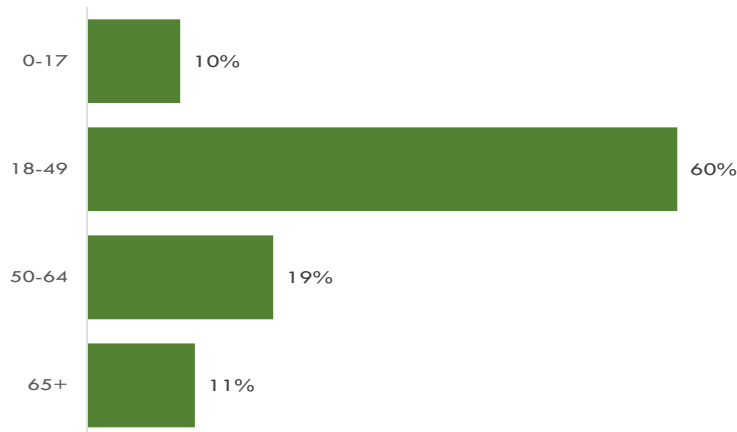

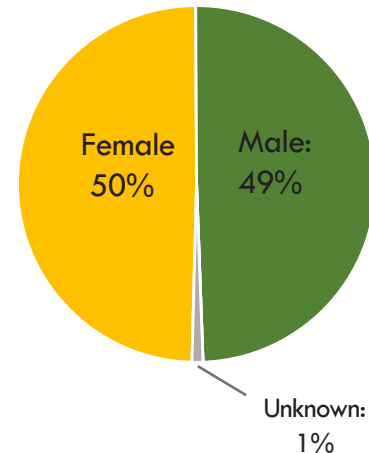

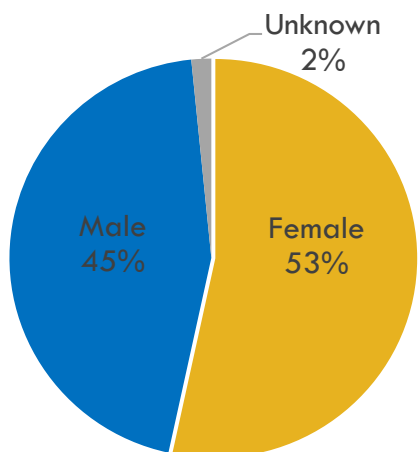
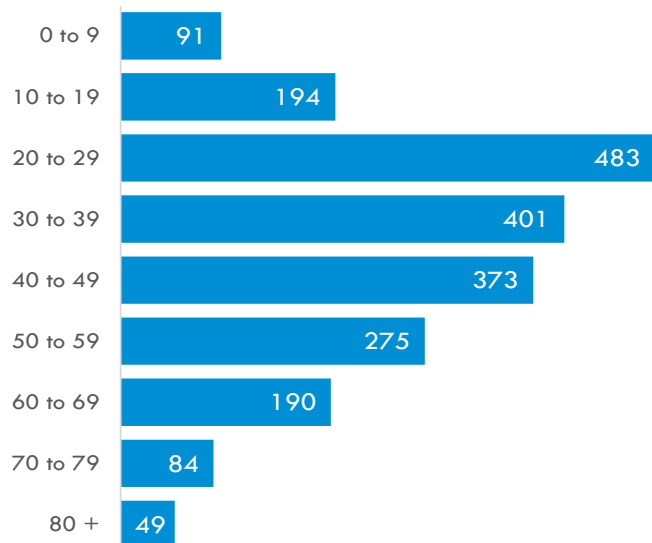
### Case and death disparities:

- For all adults ages 18+, Latinos and African Americans are dying at disproportionately high rates. The proportion of COVID-19 deaths in Latinos is more than 1.5 times their population representation across all adult age categories.
- More males (57%) are dying from COVID-19 than females (43%).

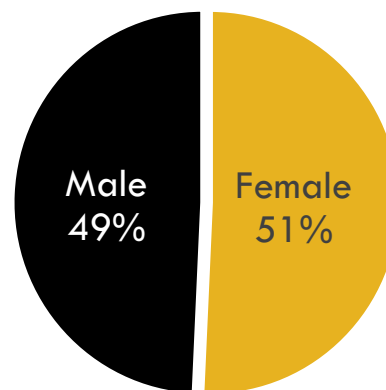
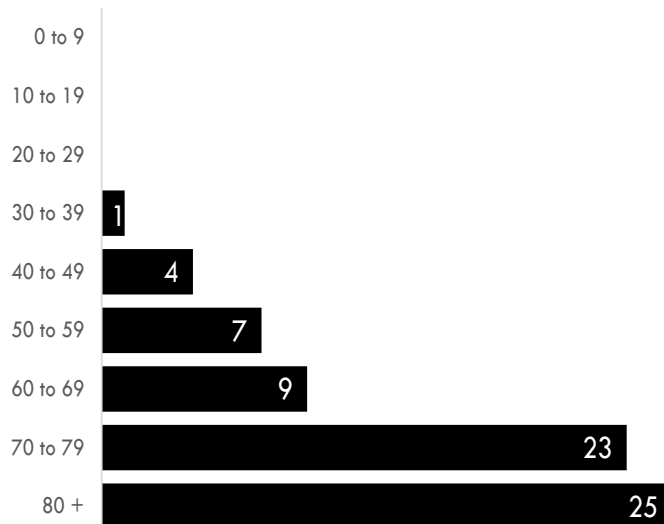

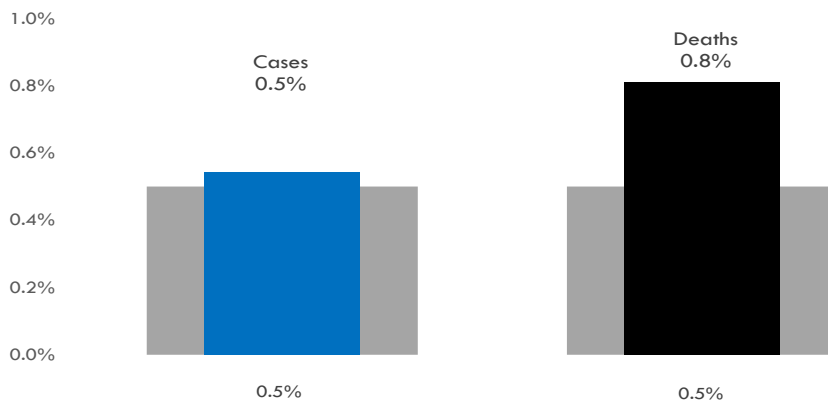
Positive COVID-19 cases among AIAN people in California by Age Group and Gender

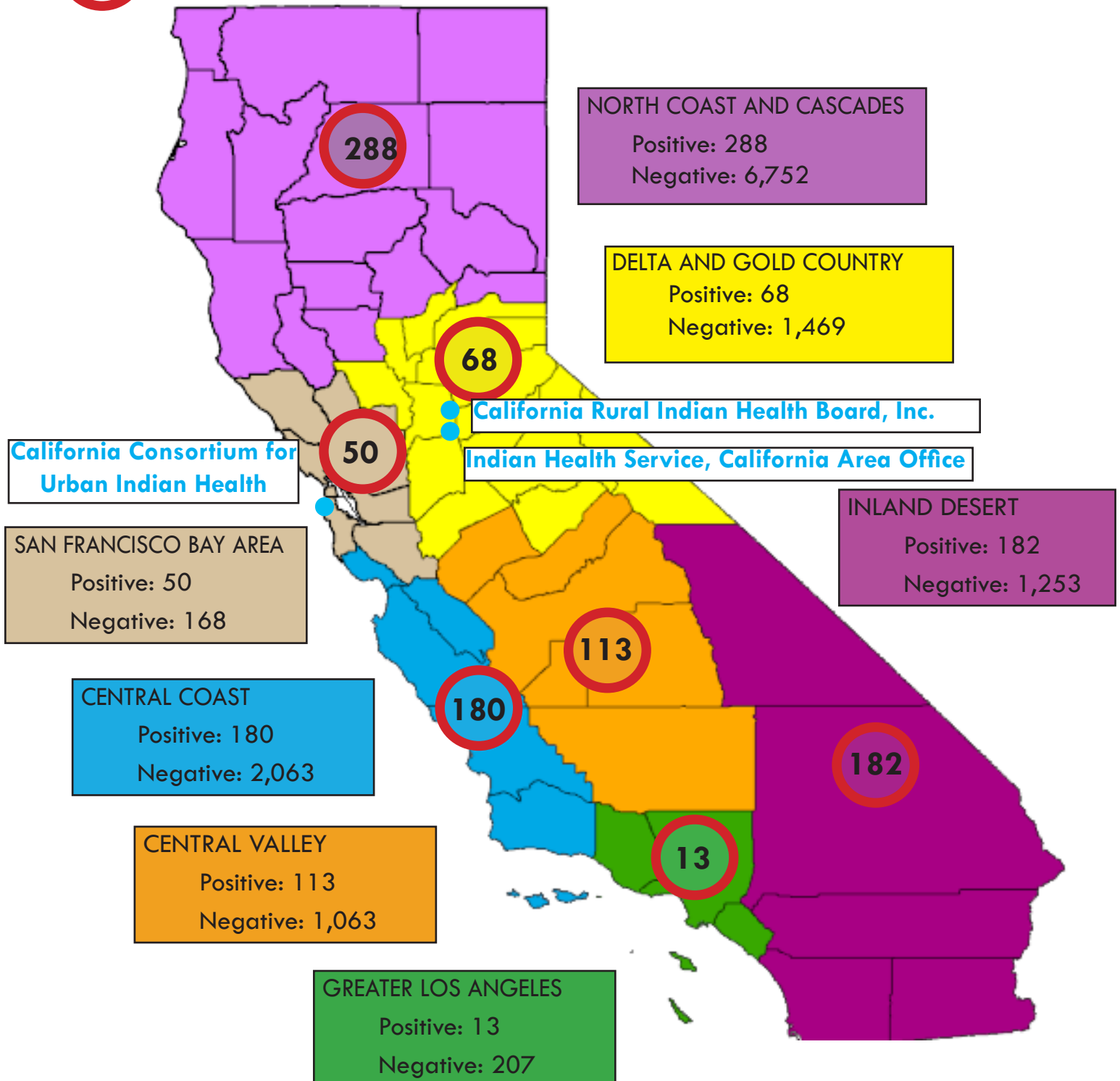

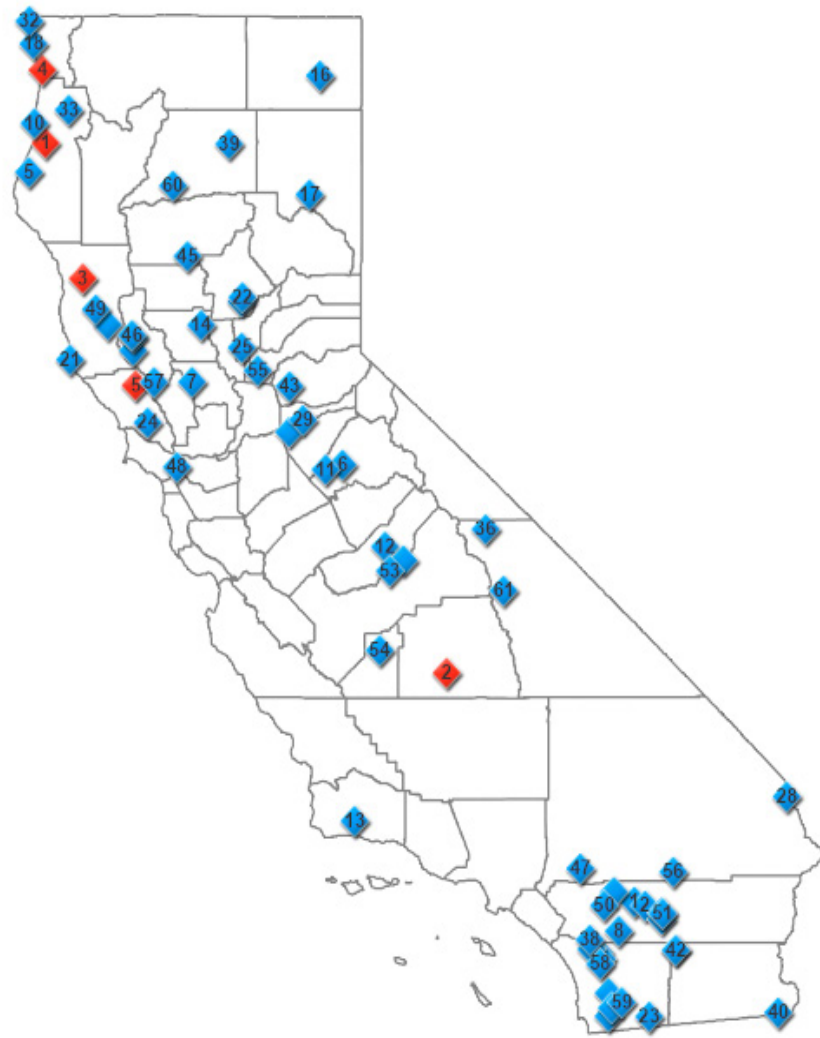
