

DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 108.8 million with more than 2.4 million deaths.

In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 27,542,421 and deaths at 485,070.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is organizing a 3-day virtual forum that will bring together practitioners from national, state, tribal, local, and territorial levels who are engaged in vaccinating communities across the country. The forum will support the Administration's goals of mounting safe, effective, and comprehensive vaccine implementation strategies to protect those most at risk and advance health equity, particularly among communities that have been most disproportionately affected by COVID-19. 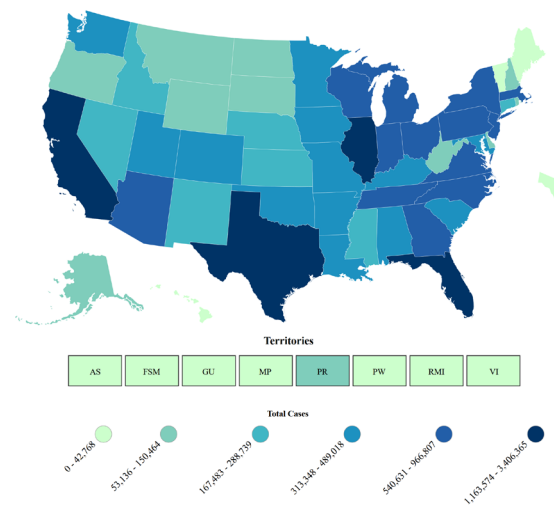
A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:

- meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or
 - meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or
 - meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.
- State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

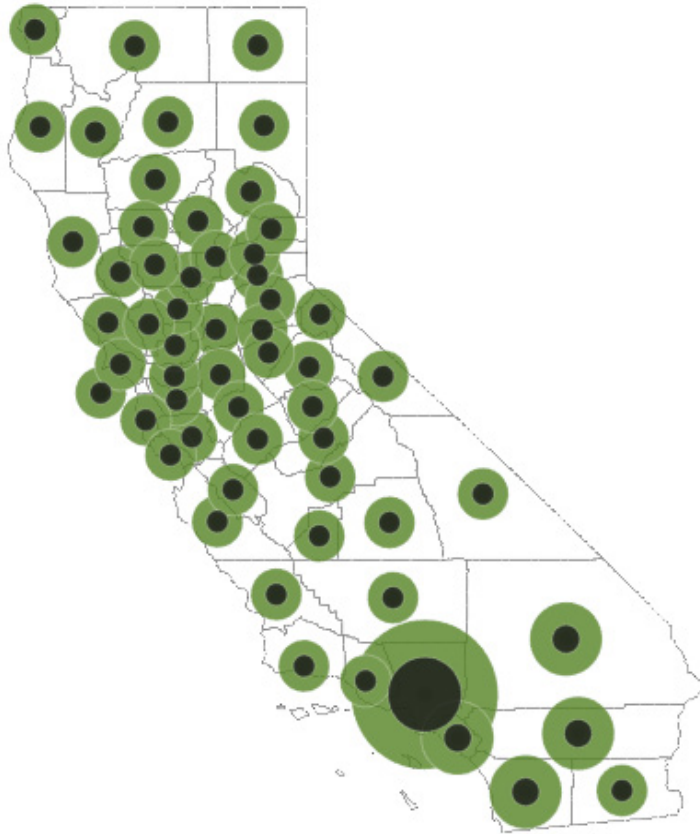

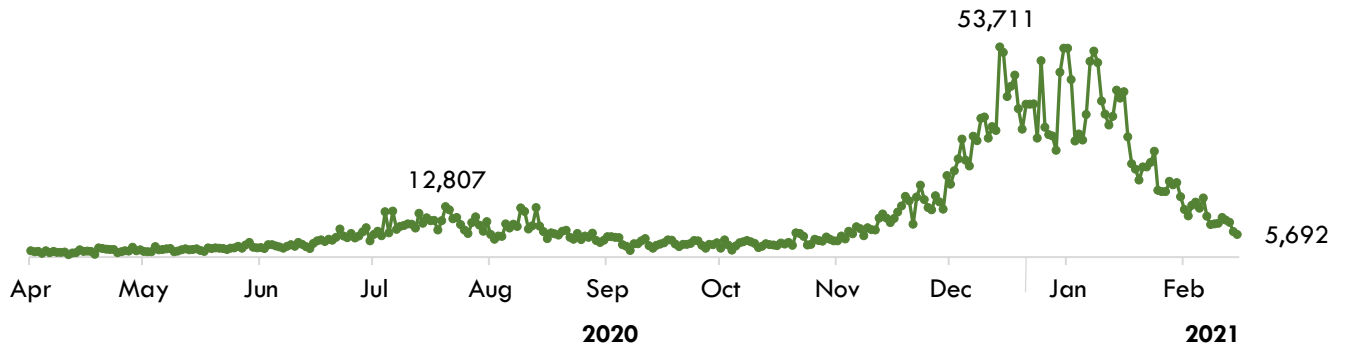

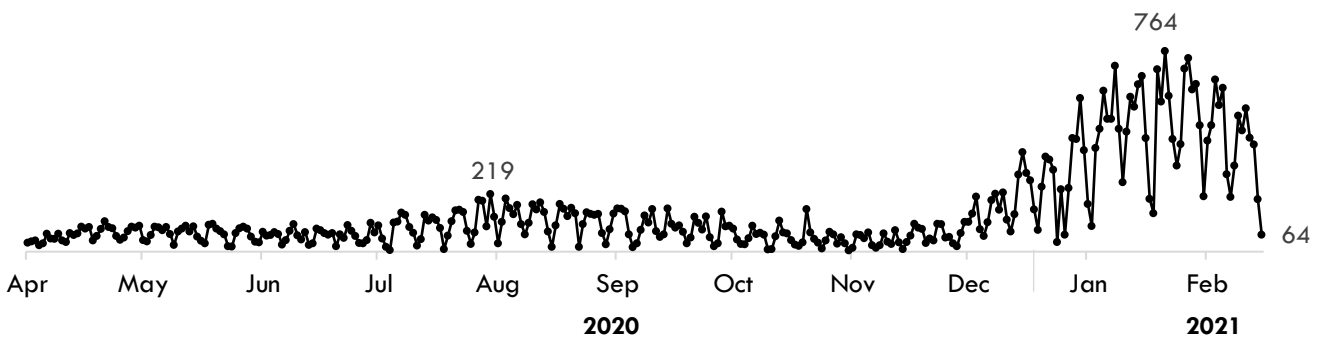

New Confirmed Cases in California by Date



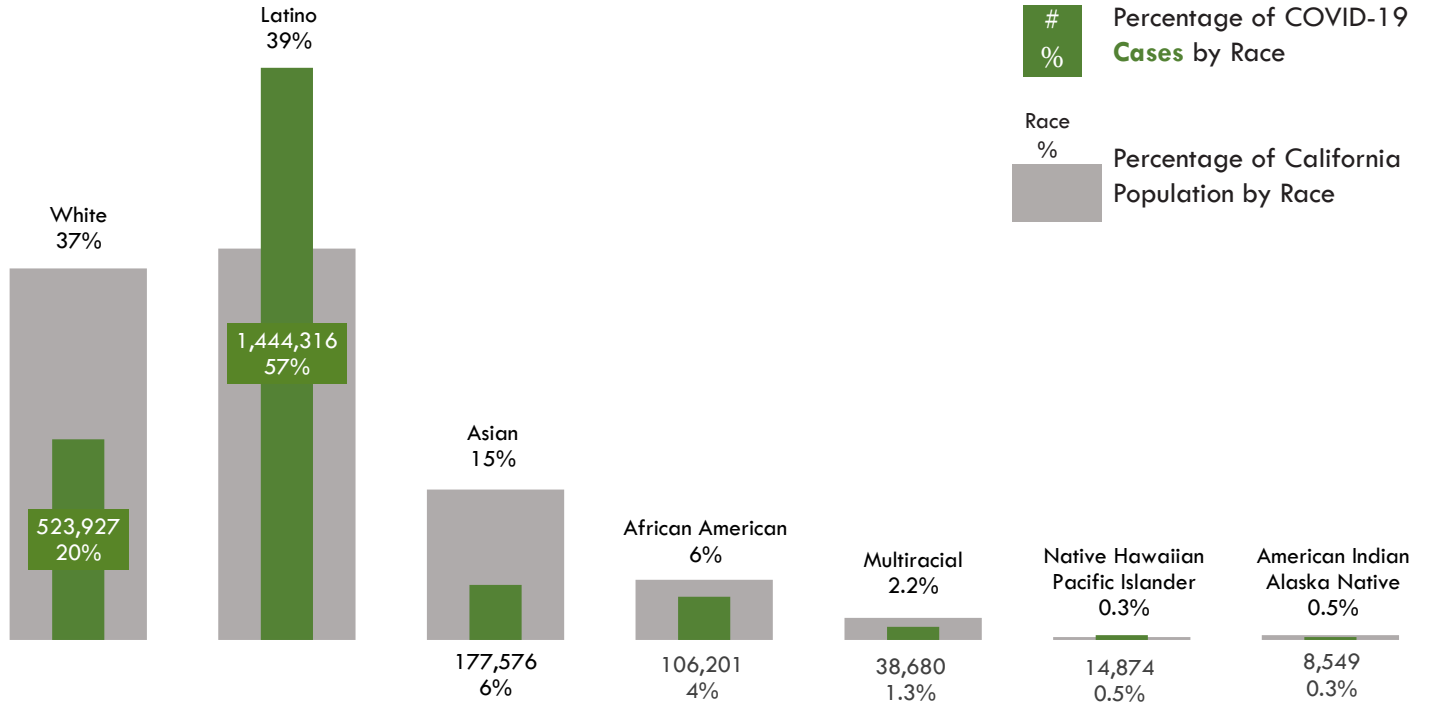
New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date



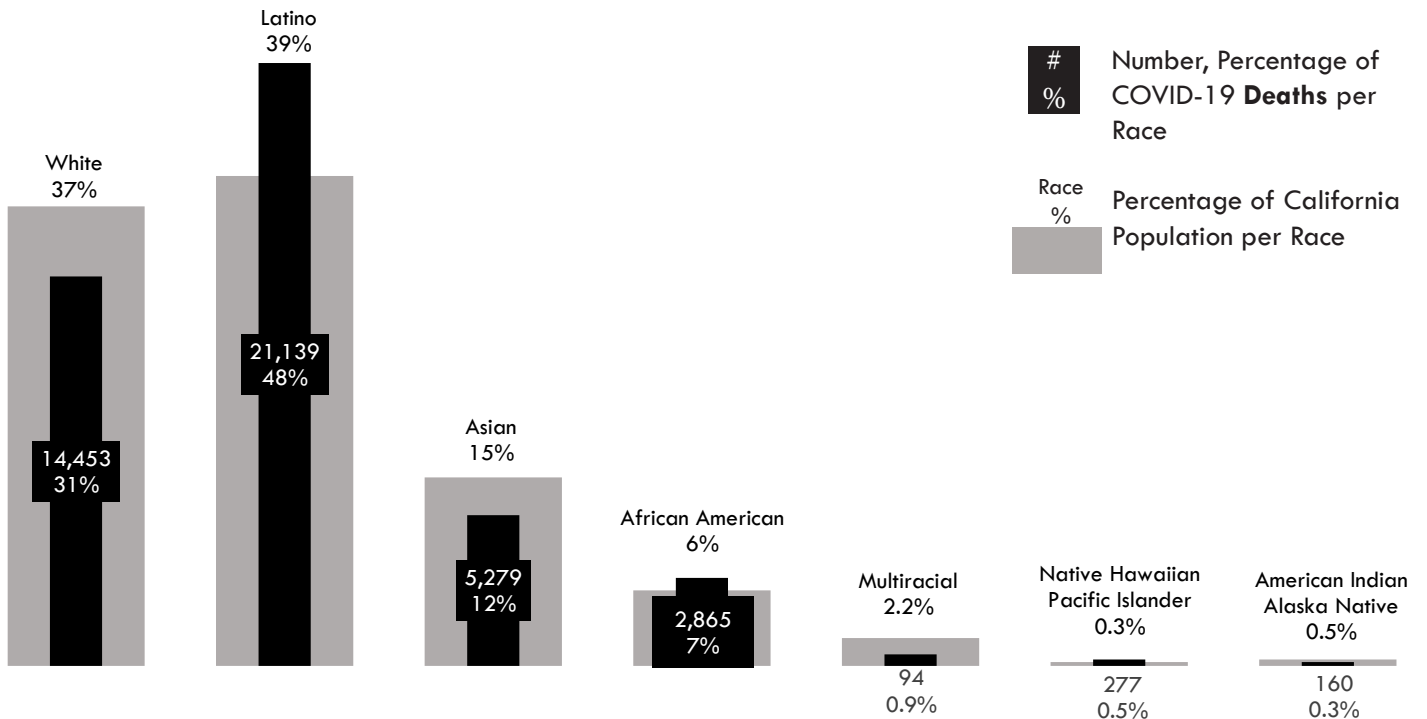

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, **0.3% of COVID-19 cases**, and **0.3% of deaths** in California. This includes a total of **8,549 cases** and **160 deaths** among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.



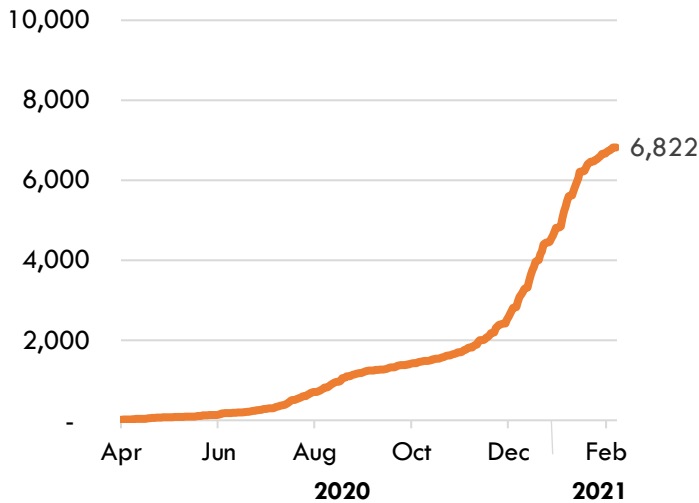

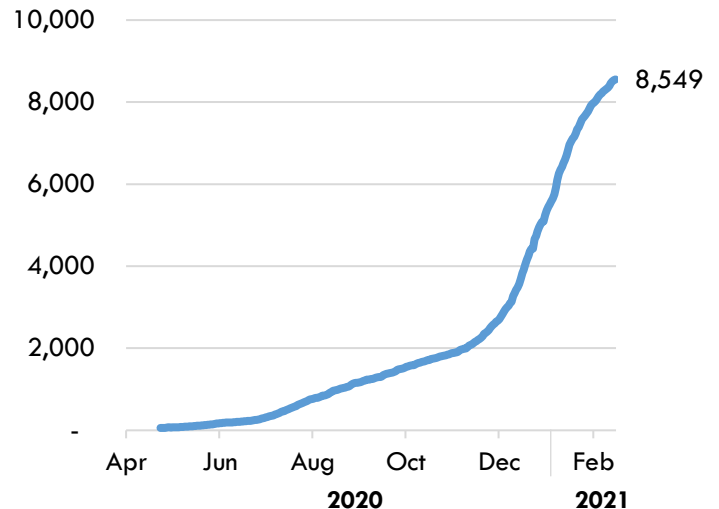

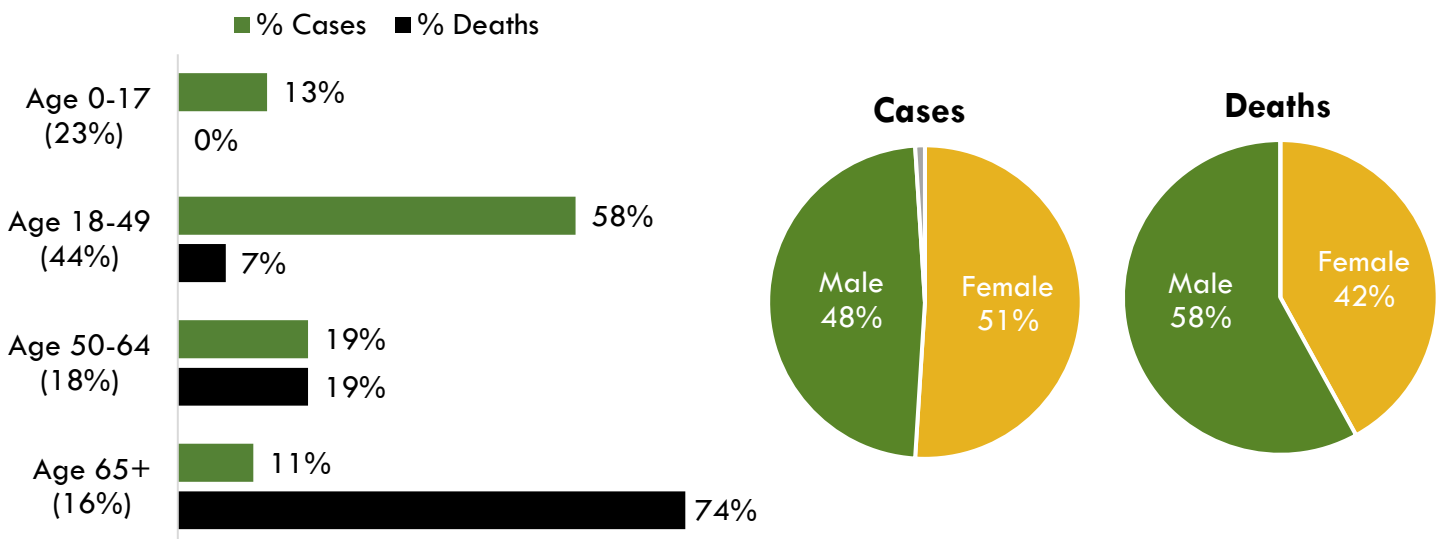

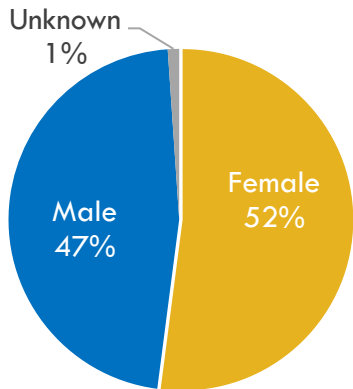
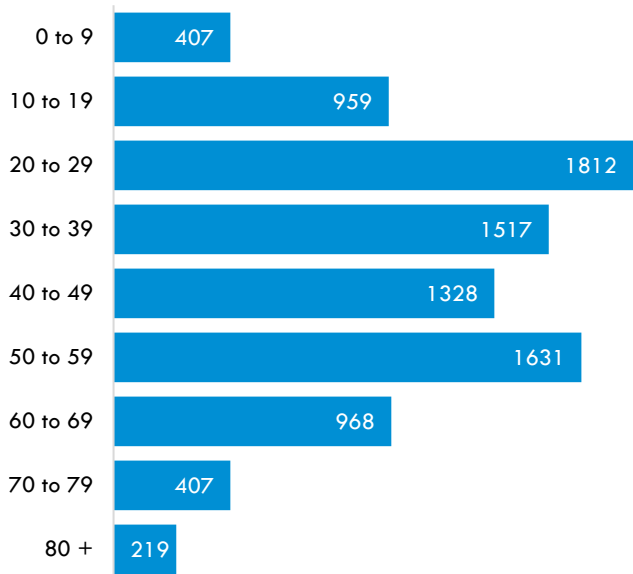

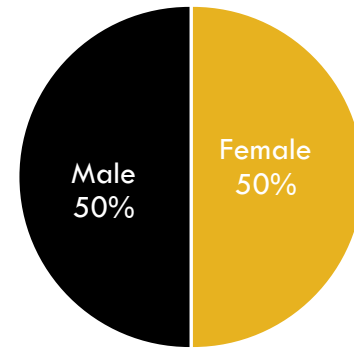
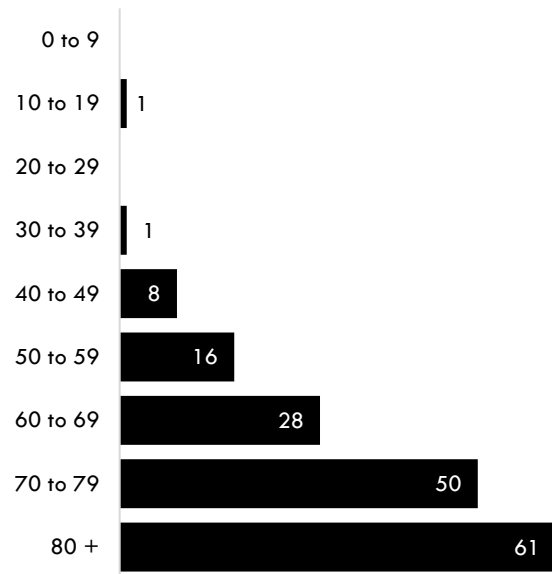

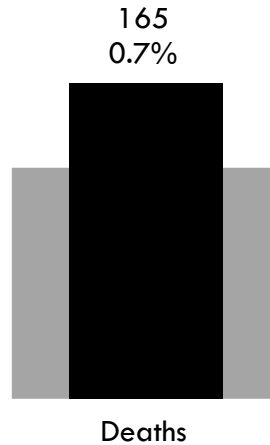
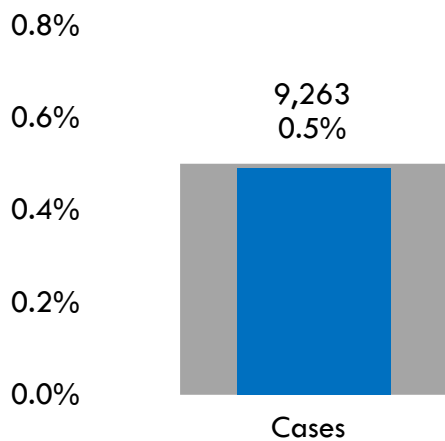
Positive COVID-19 cases among AIAN people in California by Age Group and Gender

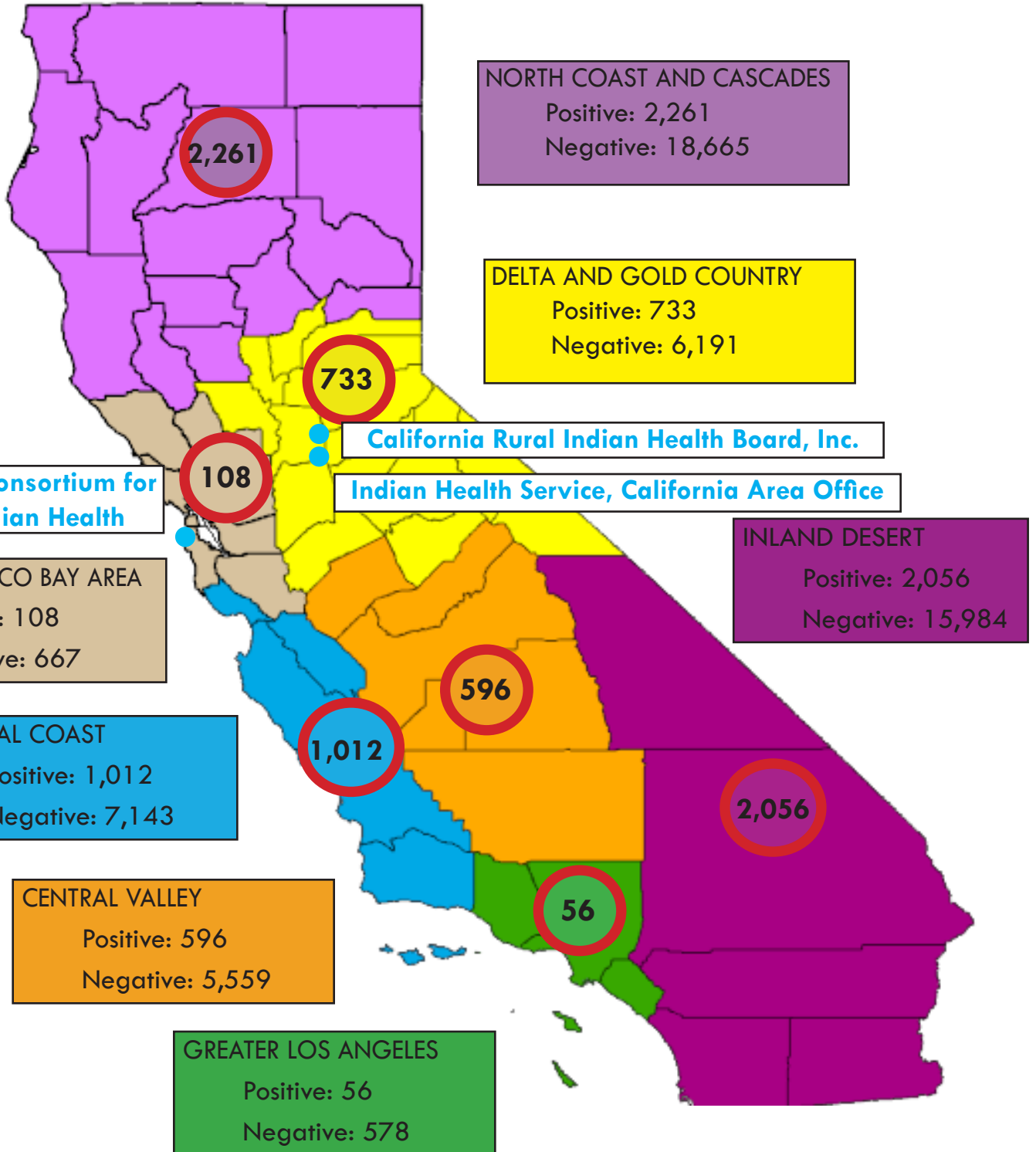

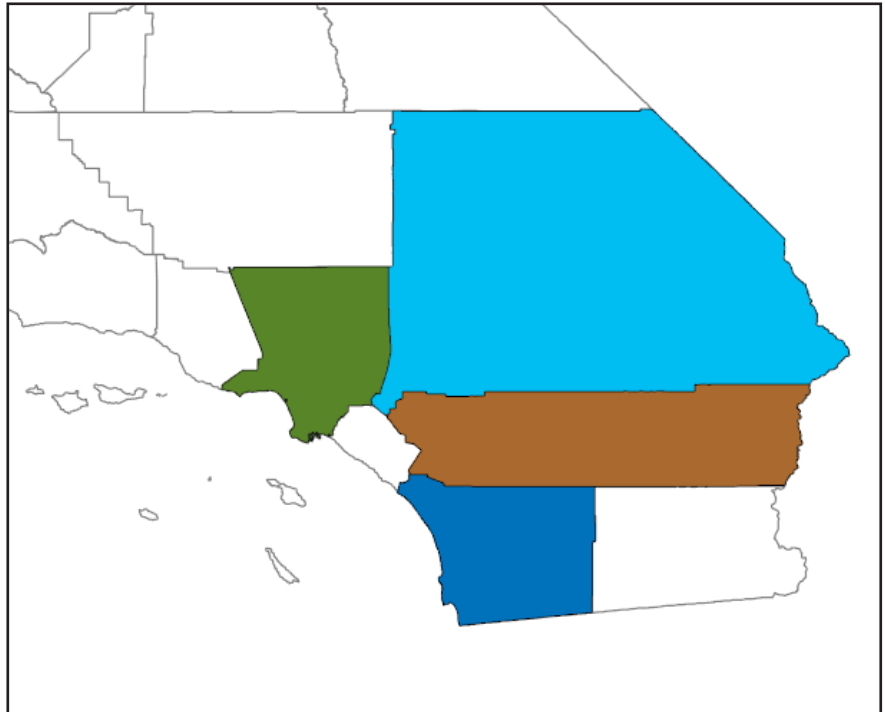

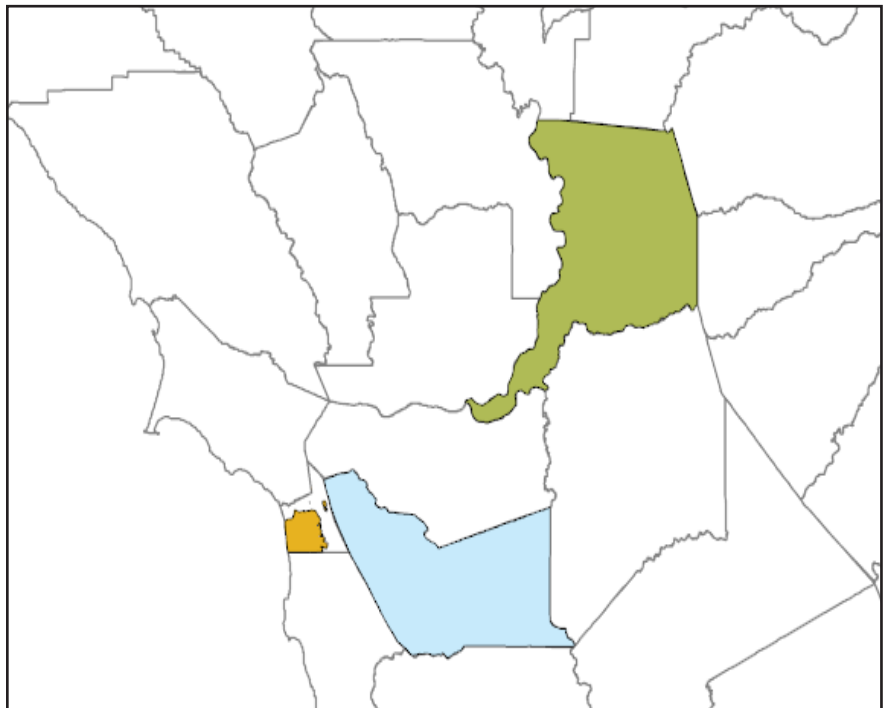
