REQUIRED FACE COVERING WHILE USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION



Effective February 2, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is requiring all individuals to wear a face covering while on all public transportation across the United States. A face covering should completely cover the mouth and nose.

Face coverings must also be worn while waiting for and getting on or off transportation at airports, subway stations, bus stops, train stations, etc.

EXCEP	TIONS	INCL	UDE:

- While eating or drinking.
- Children under the age of two.
- Disabled persons who are not able to wear a face covering safely.
 Workers whose duties cannot be
- performed safely with a face covering.
- In private transportation for personal, non-commercial use.

To verify one's identity.

Refusing to wear a mask may result in being refused transportation service or being asked to disembark at the earliest, safest opportunity.

Evidence shows that this step will help lower the transmission of COVID-19.
