

### CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATIONAL REPORT #240 MARCH 1, 2021



#### **DAILY HIGHLIGHTS**

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 113.8 million with more than 2.5 million deaths.

In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 28,405,925 and deaths at 511,839.

On February 27, Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for the Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) COVID-19 Vaccine and on February 28, Janssen's single-dose COVID-19 vaccine was unanimously recommended by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. The state will dedicate 10% of vaccines to K-12 school staff and childcare workers starting March 1. These workers will get special codes that let them schedule expedited appointments through myturn.ca.gov. See the allocation plan HERE.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), in partnership with Boston Children's Hospital and Castlight Health, is launching a new tool that allows Americans to search for COVID-19 vaccine providers with stock of vaccine where they live. #### COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance\*


- Total cases: 28,405,925
- Total deaths: 511,839
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 55 (50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands)

\*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.

A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:

i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID19. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.



#### INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE CALIFORNIA AREA

70,210 Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program patients in the California Area have been tested for COVID-19 as of 2/27/2021.

Of these, 7,393 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 59,097 have tested negative for COVID-19.






New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date





#### Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, 0.3% of COVID-19 cases, and 0.3% of deaths in California. This includes a total of 8,882 cases and 174 deaths among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.






## Two sources for tracking American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) cases reported in California





## American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) data reported by California to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)




CDC data show that AIAN in California are testing positive for COVID-19 at rates that are proportionate to their population in California but dying at rates that are higher. This includes a total of 22,021 cases and 348 deaths.






