DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 115.2 million with more than 2.5 million deaths.

In the United States as of March 4, the total number of cases stands at 28,580,198 and deaths at 517,224.

The state introduces vaccine equity metric to update Blueprint for a Safer Economy based on vaccinating the state's hardest hit communities against COVID-19. California sets aside 40 percent of vaccine doses for most impacted communities. This seeks to reach 2 million vaccine doses in those communities to move counties through tiers and open more activities safely. As vaccination increases and disease spread slows, counties will be able to move through tiers more quickly with modestly higher case rates. Read more [HERE](#).

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), in partnership with Boston Children's Hospital and Castlight Health, is launching a new tool that allows Americans to search for COVID-19 vaccine providers with stock of vaccine where they live. COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance* (as of 3/4/21)

- Total cases: 28,580,198
- Total deaths: 517,224
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 55 (50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands)

*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.

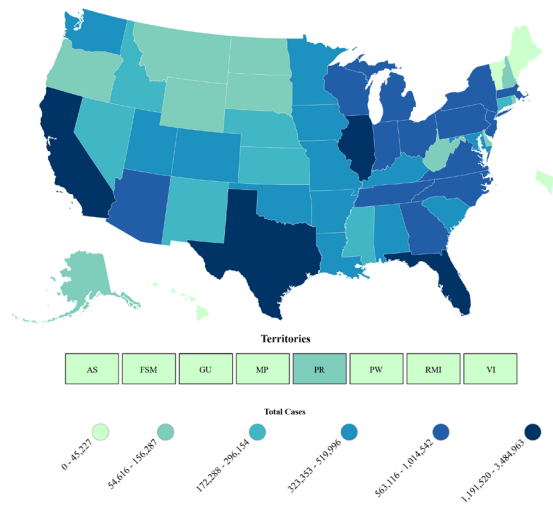
A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:

- i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.
- State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

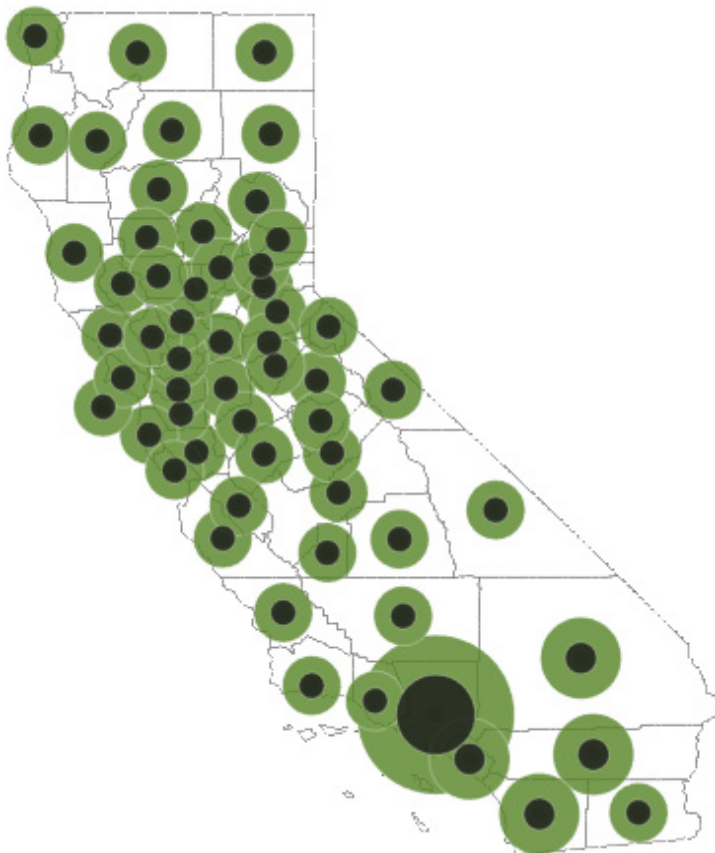

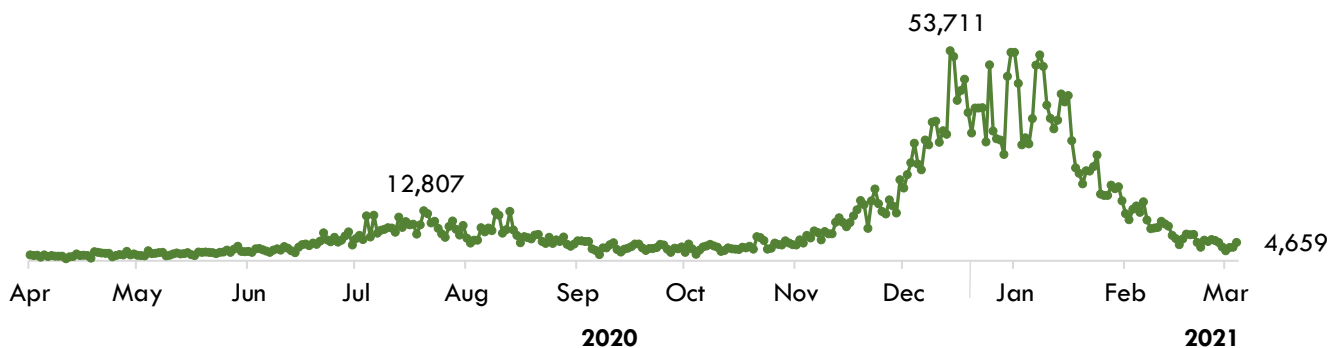

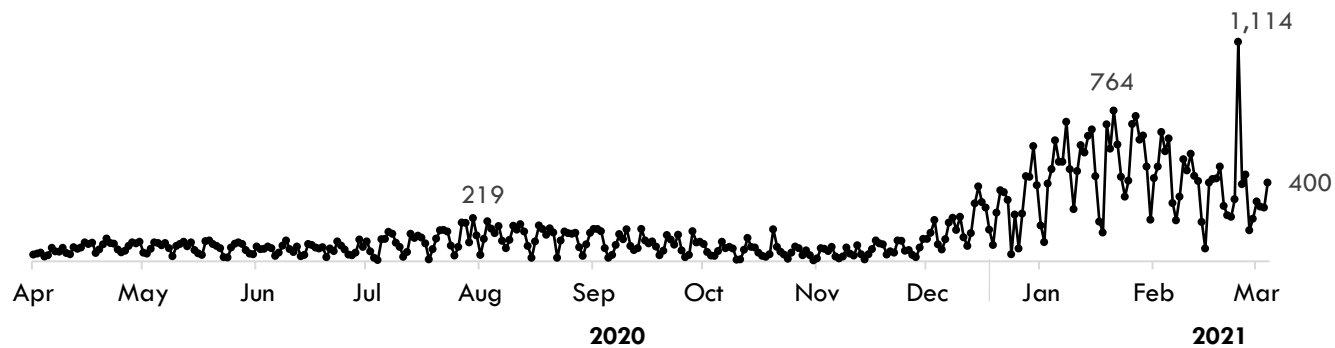

New Confirmed Cases in California by Date



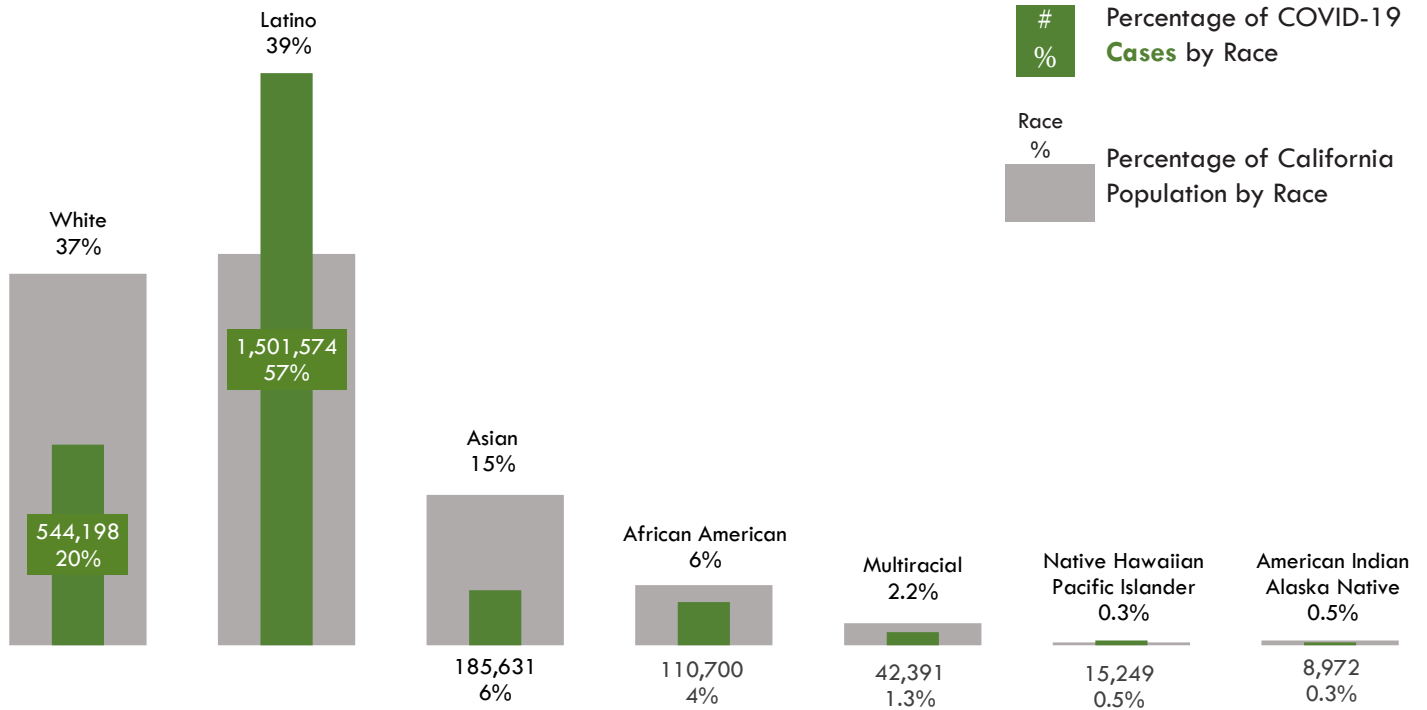
New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date



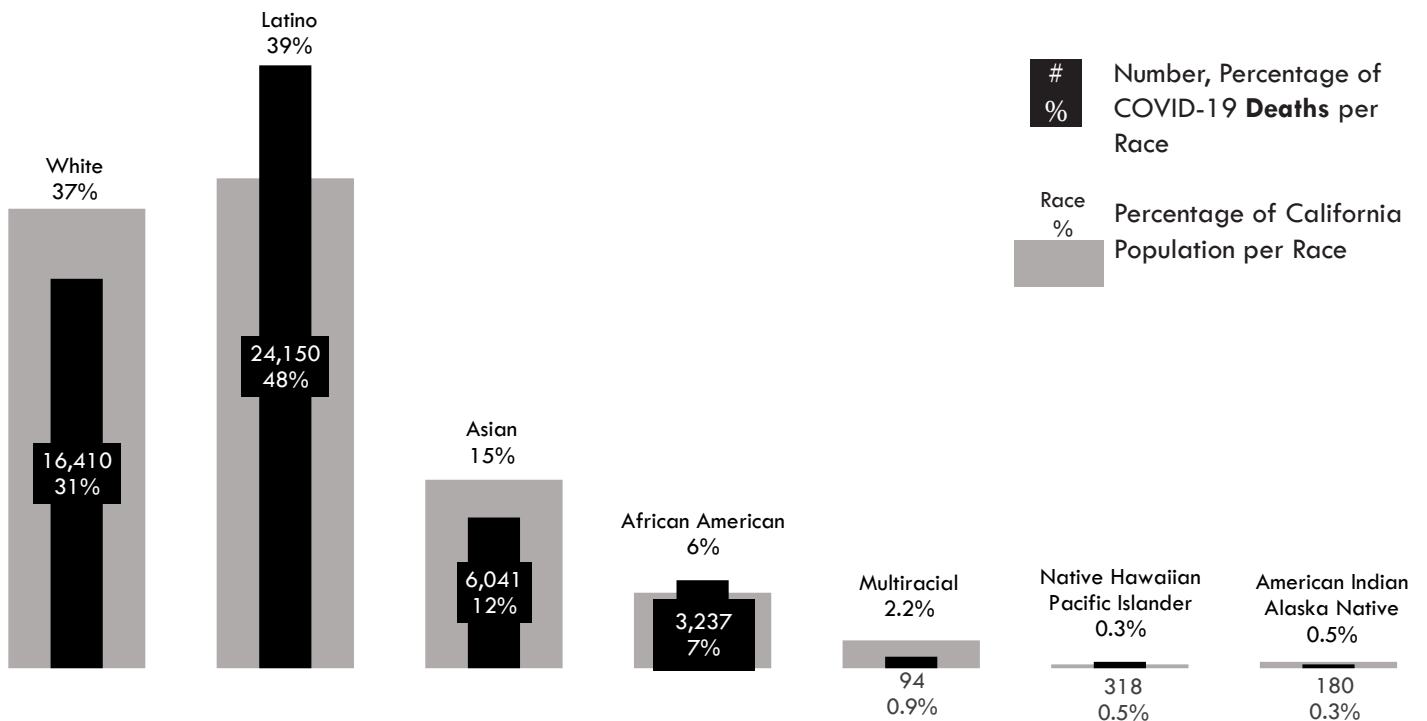

Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, **0.3% of COVID-19 cases**, and **0.3% of deaths** in California. This includes a total of **8,972 cases** and **180 deaths** among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.



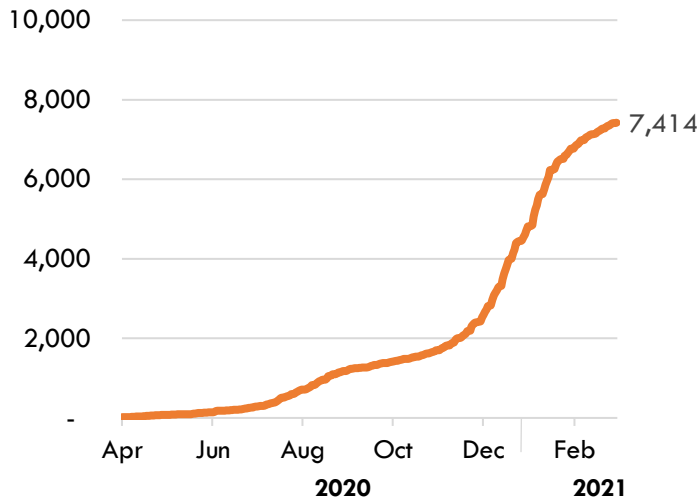

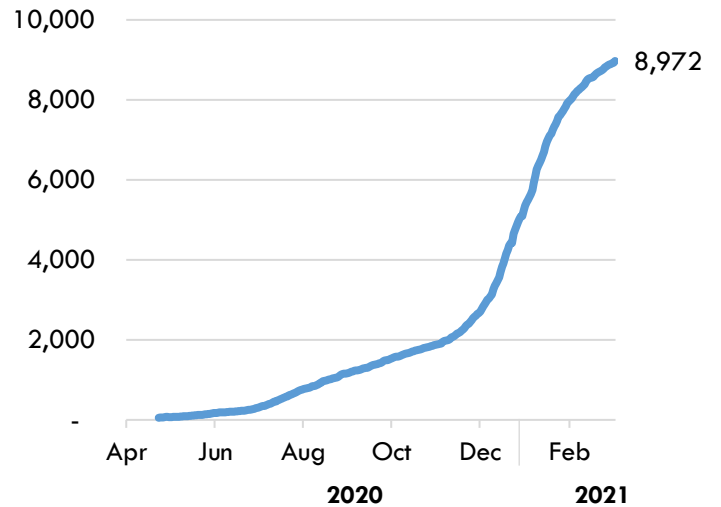

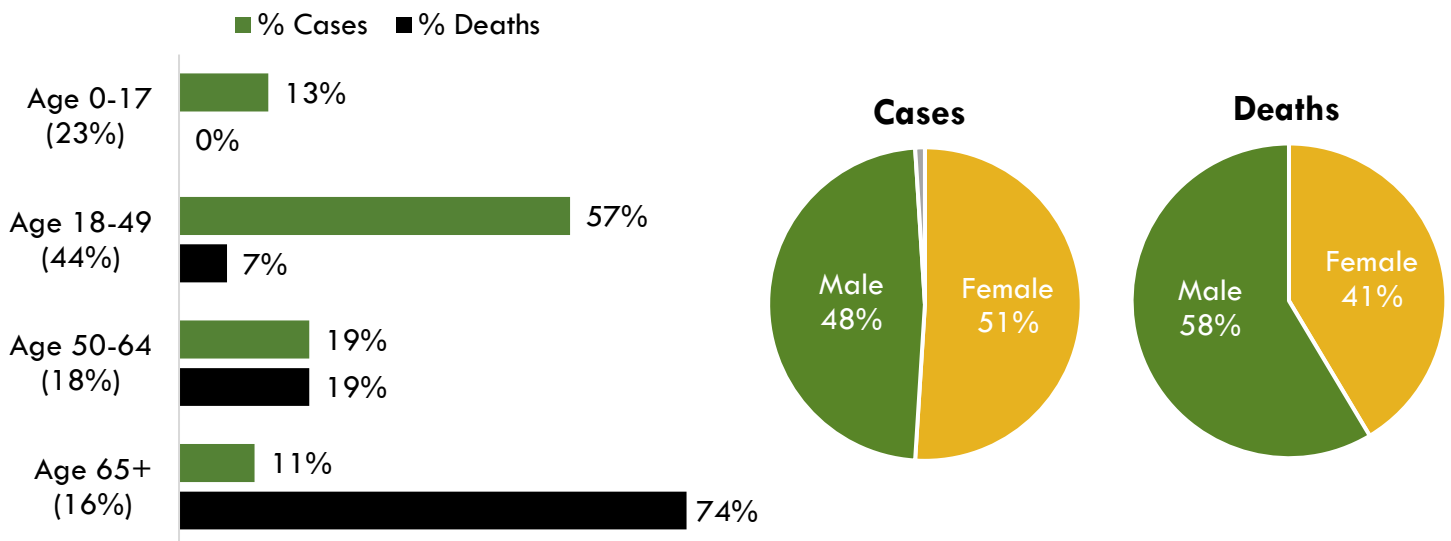

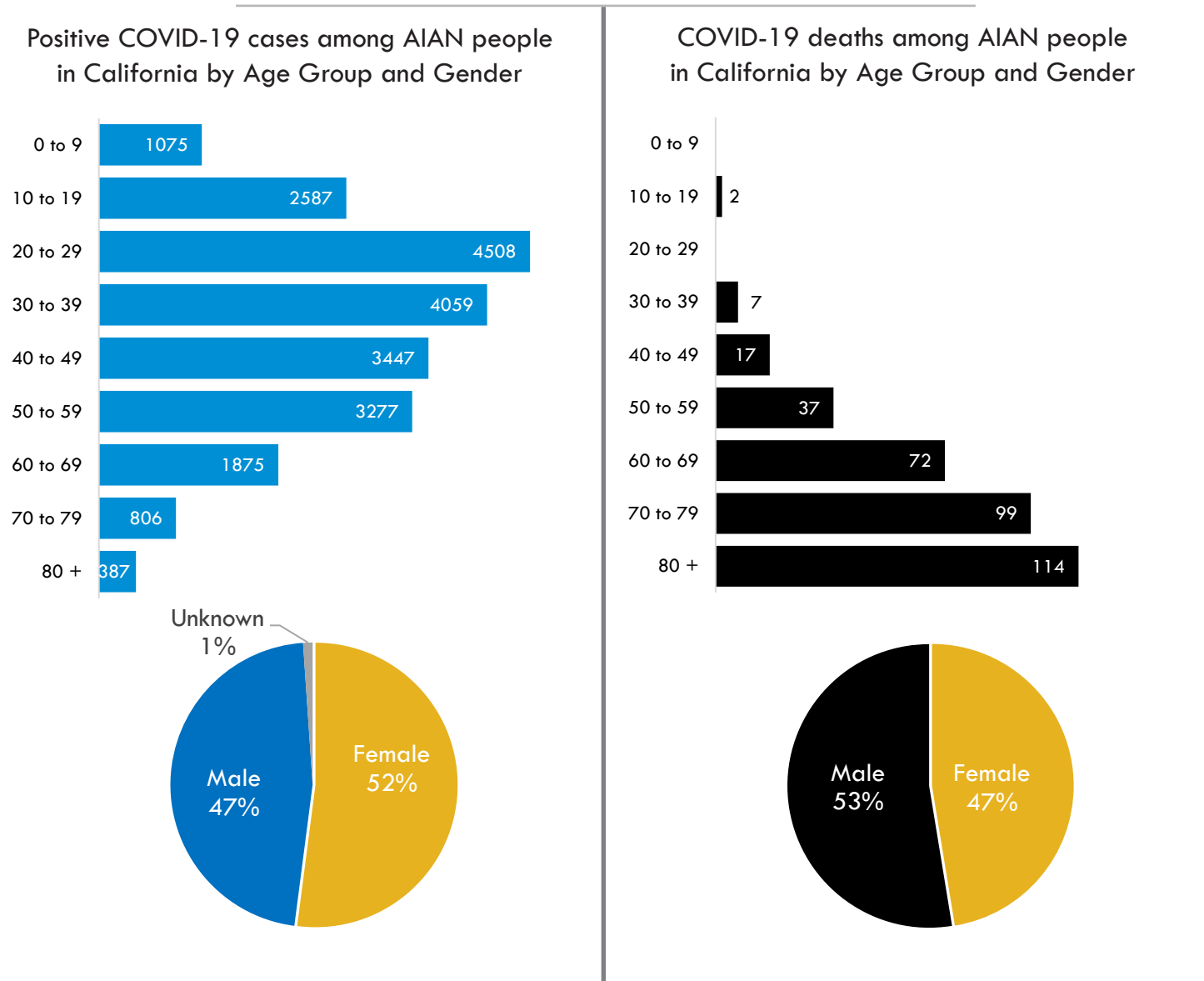

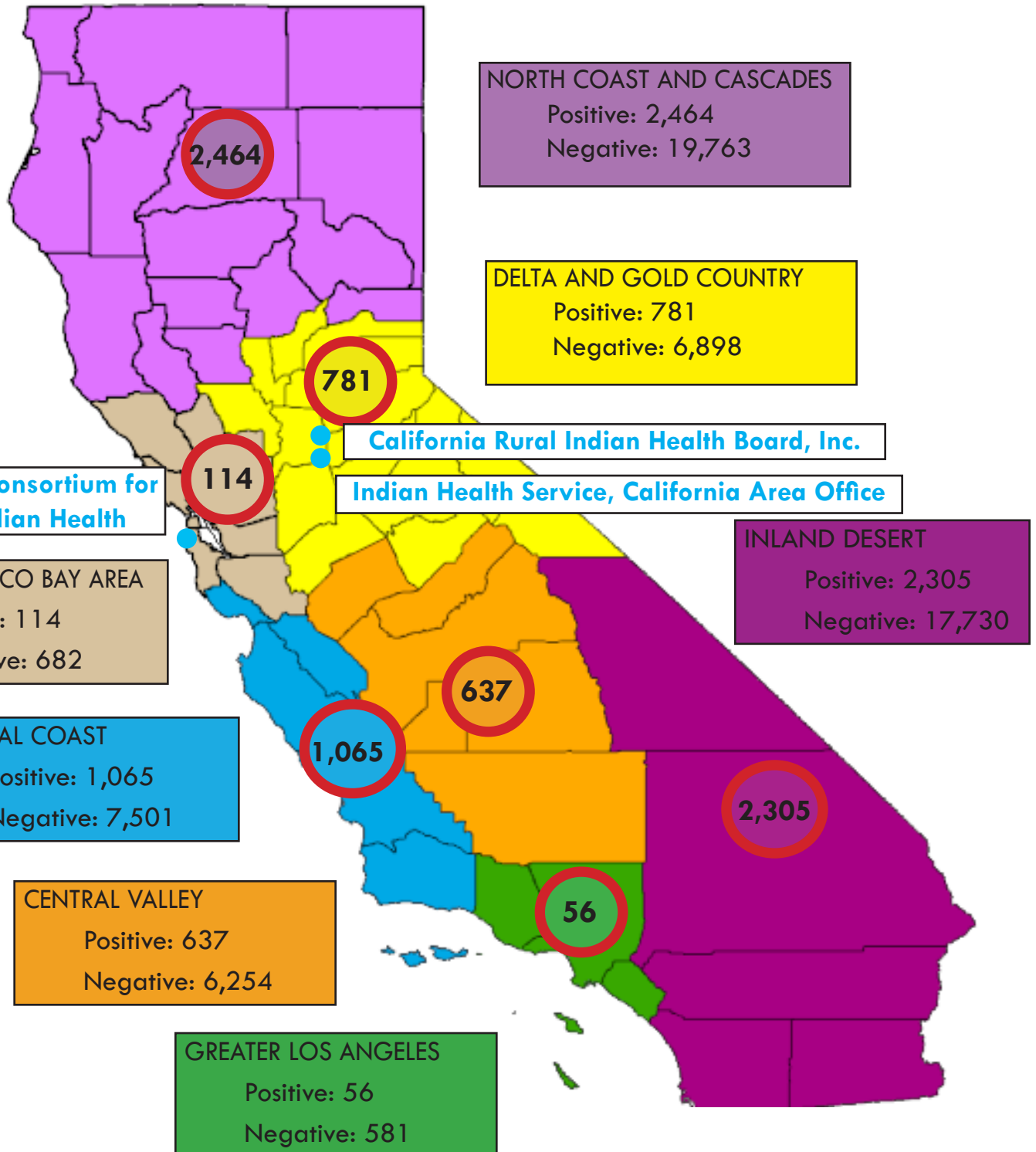

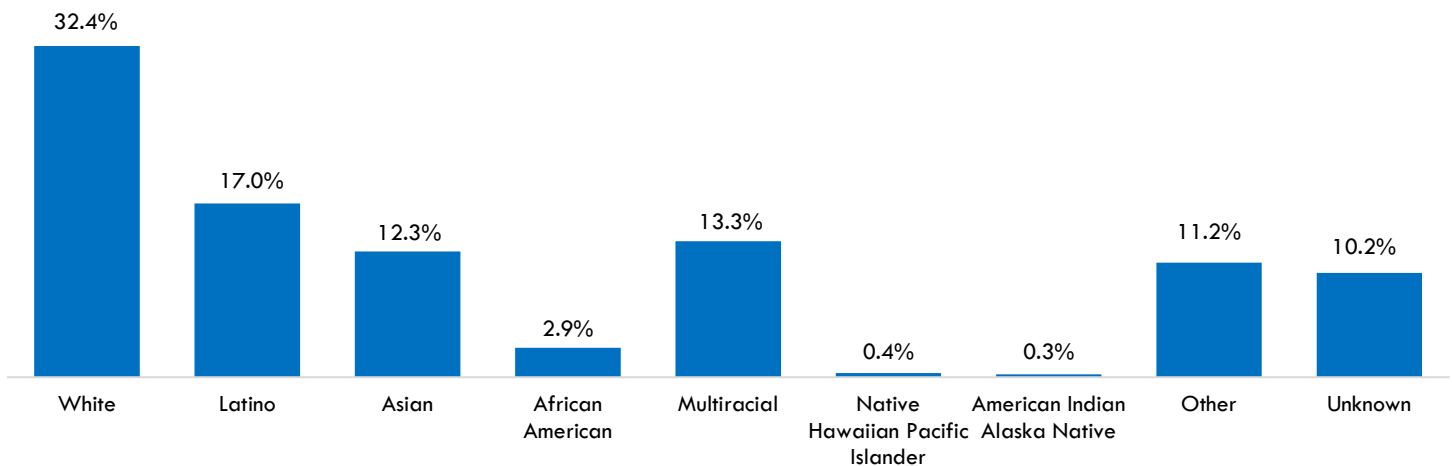

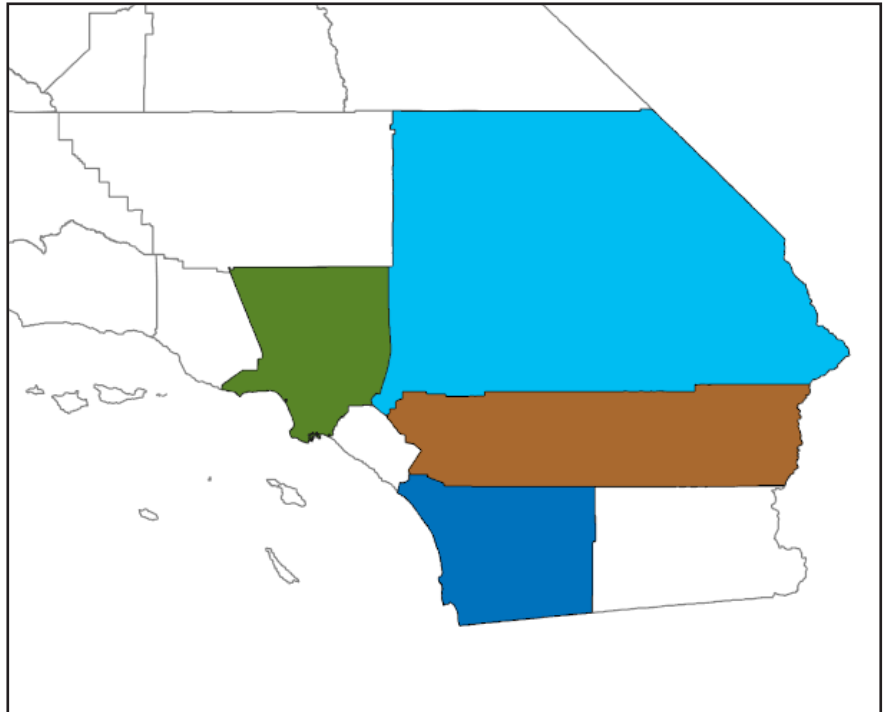

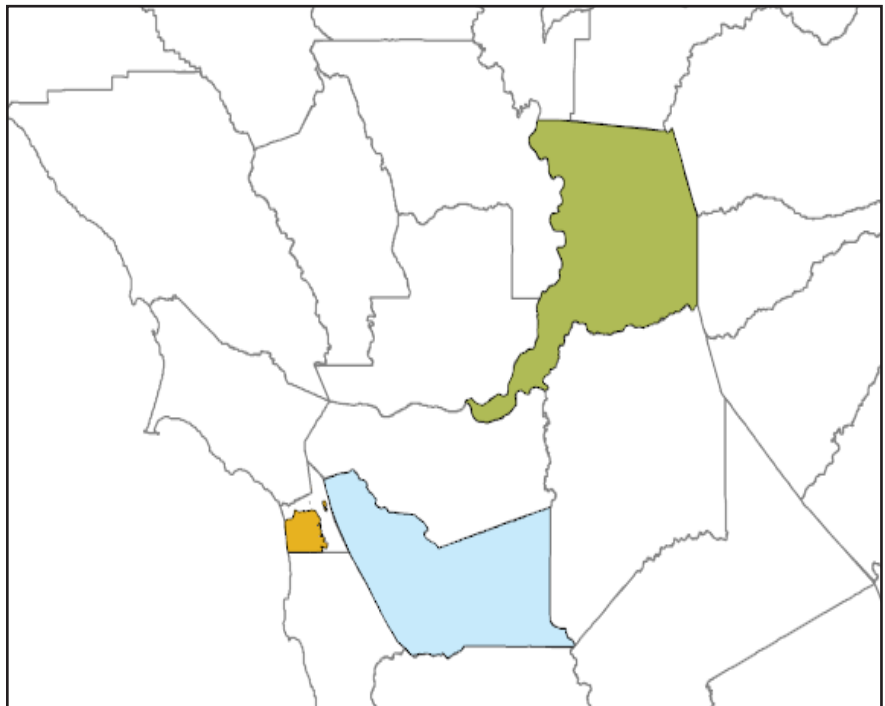

Tribes do not need to issue a state of emergency to access FEMA resources.

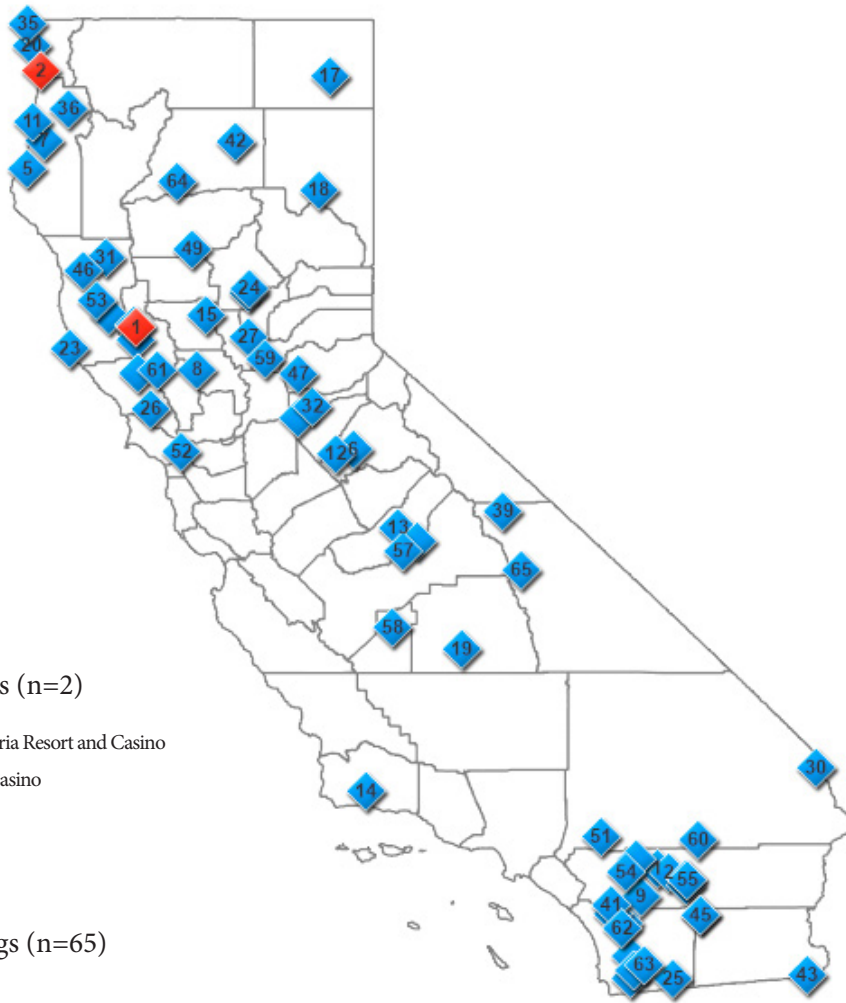
