# CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATIONAL REPORT \#259 MARCH 26, 2021 

## DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 125.1 million with more than 2.7 million deaths.
In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 29,903,245 and deaths at 543,975.
The total number of COVID-19 vaccinations administered in California has reached 15 million. See vaccination statistics statewide and broken down by county HERE.

## COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance*

- Total cases: 29,903,245
- Total deaths: 543,975
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 55 (50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands)
*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.

A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:
i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID19.
State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

## INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE CALIFORNIA AREA

74,718 Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program patients in the California Area have been tested for COVID-19 as of $3 / 25 / 2021$.
Of these, 7,740 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 63,655 have tested negative for COVID-19.

## Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for $0.5 \%$ percent of the population, $0.3 \%$ of COVID- 19 cases, and $\mathbf{0 . 4} \%$ of deaths in California. This includes a total of 9,452 cases and $\mathbf{2 0 1}$ deaths among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.


California Department of Public Health has nearly complete data on race and ethnicity for COVID-19 deaths, and are reporting the following trends: Latinos, African Americans and Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders are dying at disproportionately higher levels.

California Department of Public Health reports COVID-19 data on American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) people that only identify in one racial category. Below is a comparison using CDC's data on AIAN cases and deaths in California by racial classification, using a more restrictive definition (AIAN alone) versus a more comprehensive definition (AIAN in combination with other races/ethnicities).
