Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 131 million with more than 2.8 million deaths.

In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 30,532,965 and deaths at 554,064.

Are you fully vaccinated and need to travel within the U.S.? The CDC recommends delaying travel until you are fully vaccinated, because travel increases your chance of getting and spreading COVID-19. The COVID-19 pandemic caused approximately 375,000 deaths in the United States during 2020. The age-adjusted death rate in the U.S. increased by 15.9% in 2020. Overall death rates were highest among non-Hispanic Black persons and non-Hispanic American Indian or Alaska Native persons. COVID-19 was the third leading cause of death. *As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.

A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

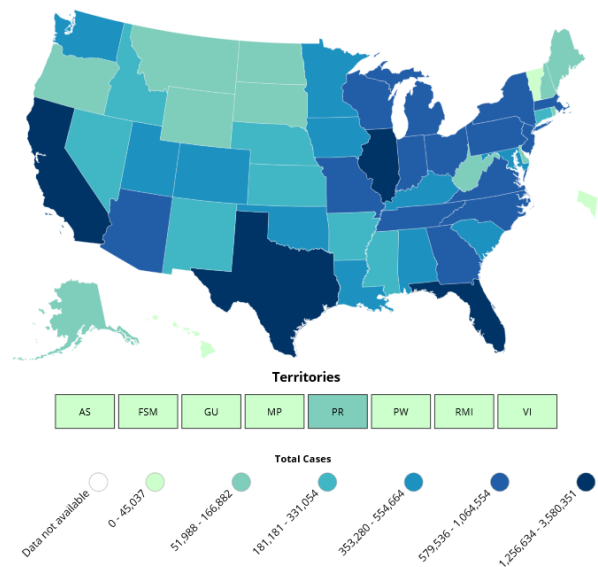
A probable case or death is defined by:

- meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or
 - meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or
 - meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.
- State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

Total Number of COVID-19 Cases in the US Reported to the CDC, by State/Territory

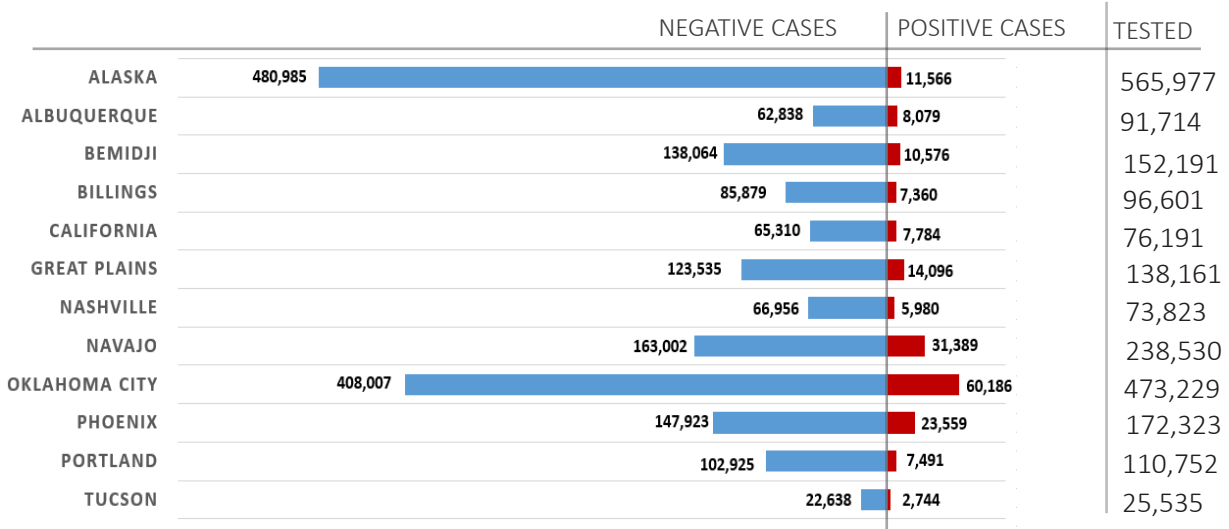

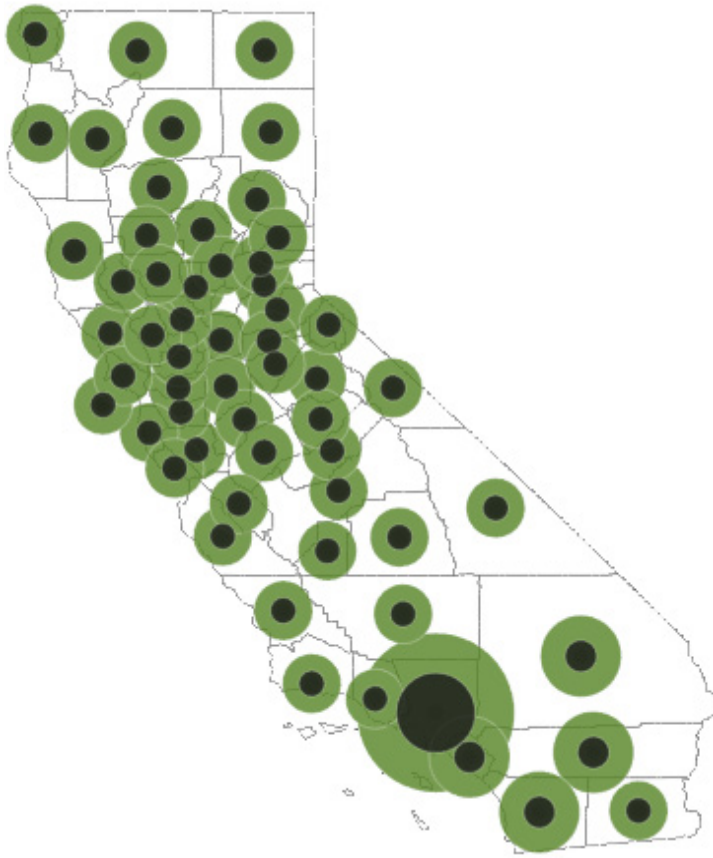

Of these, 7,784 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 65,310 have tested negative for COVID-19.

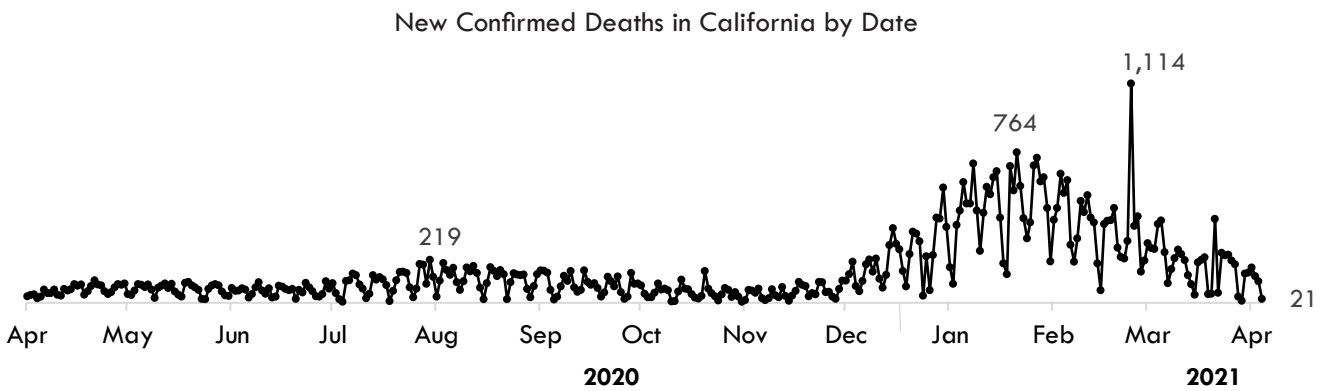
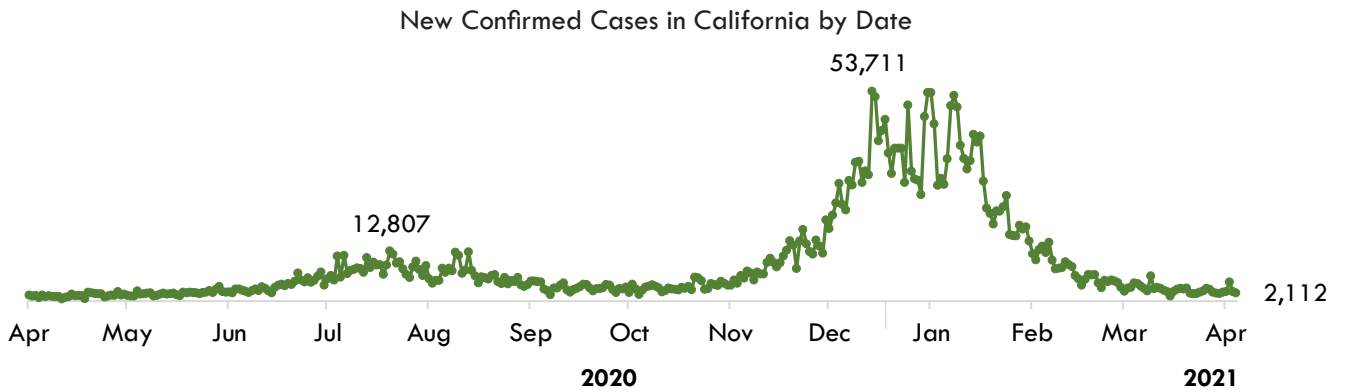

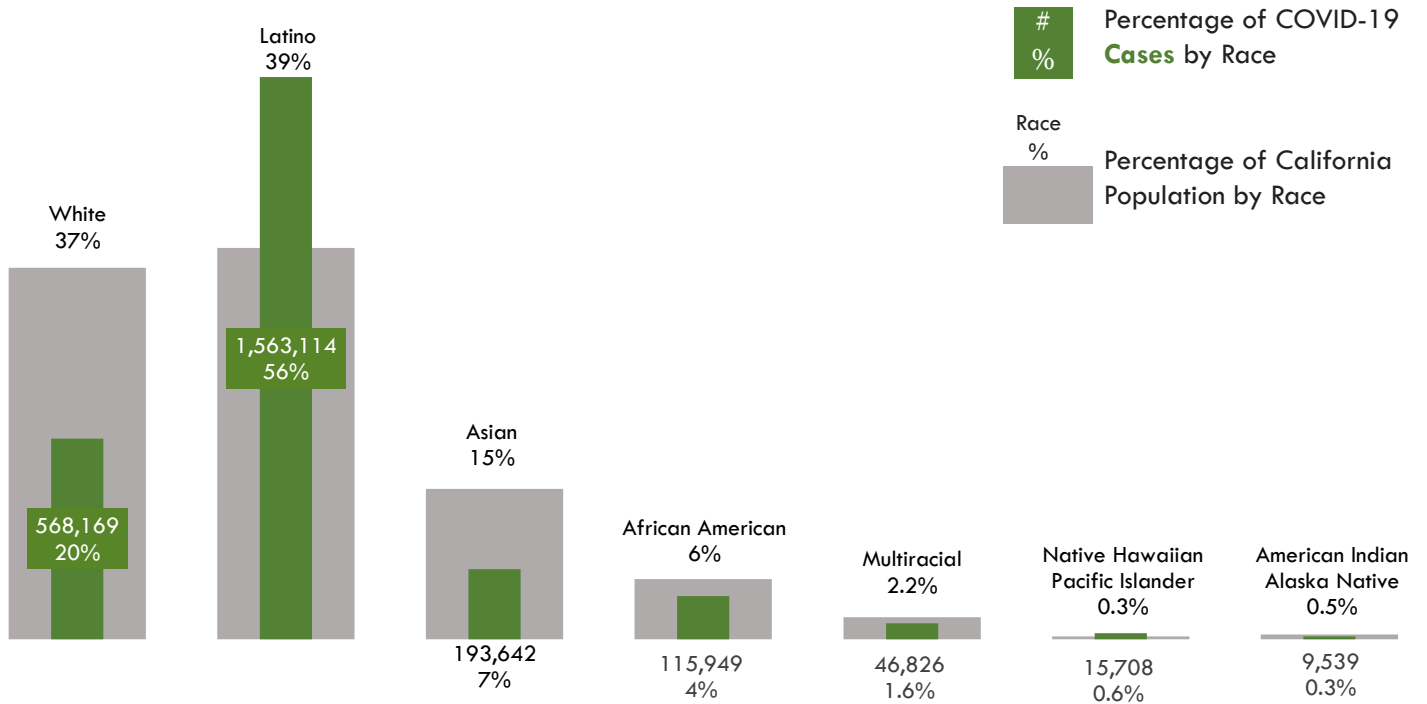

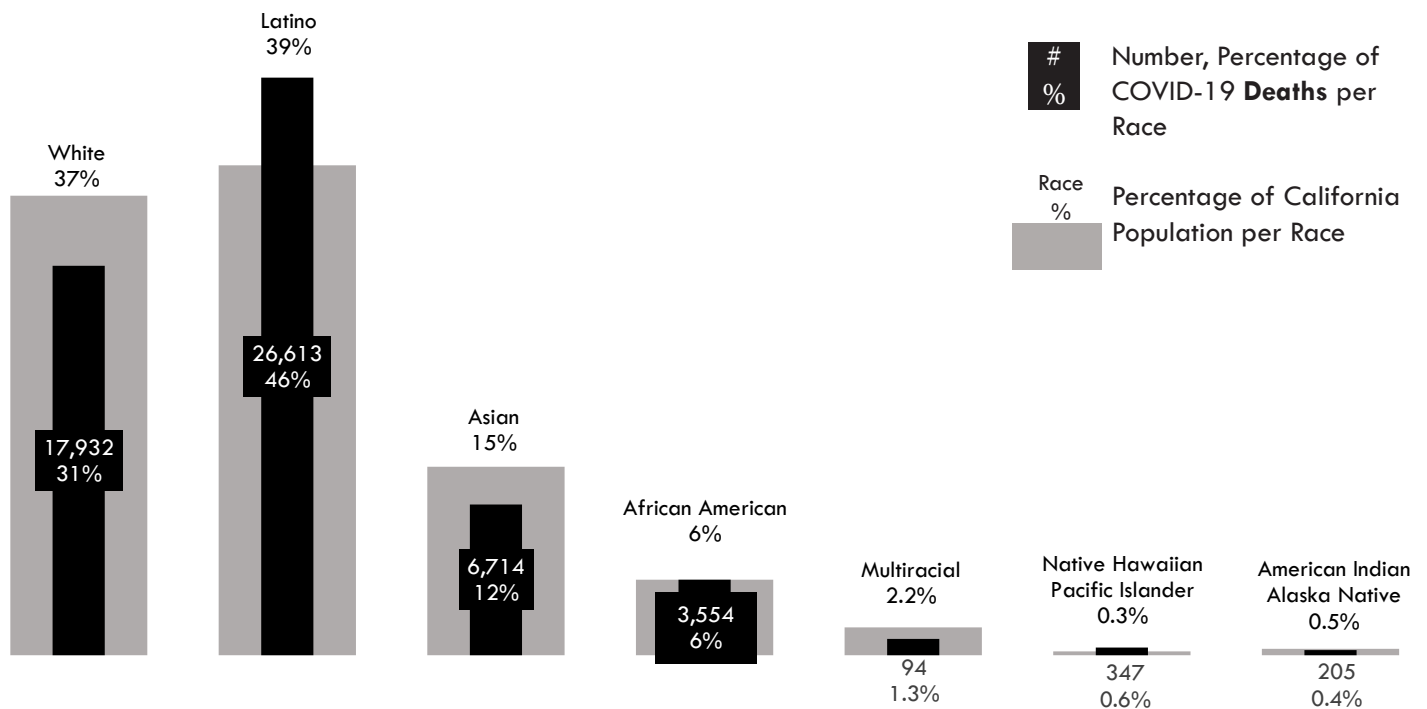

Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, **0.3% of COVID-19 cases**, and **0.4% of deaths** in California. This includes a total of **9,539 cases** and **205 deaths** among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.



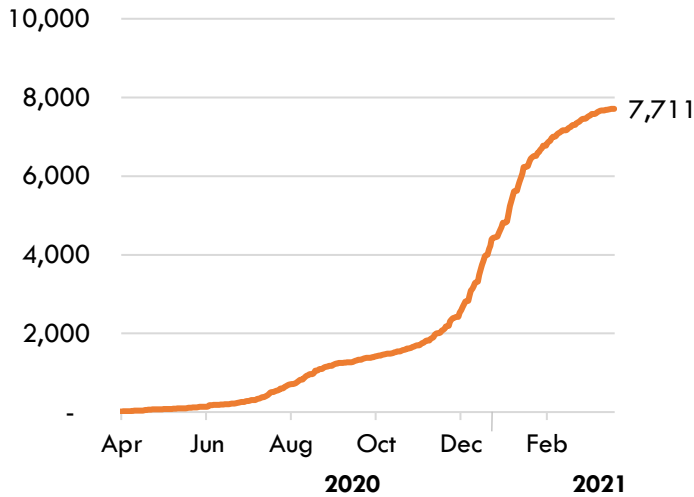

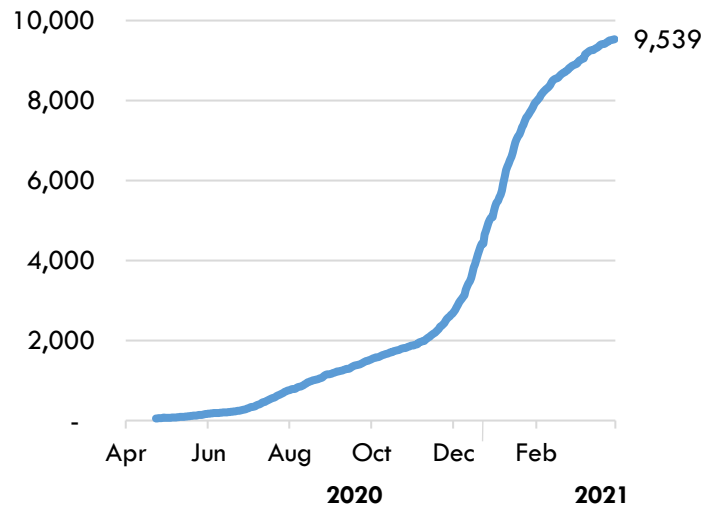

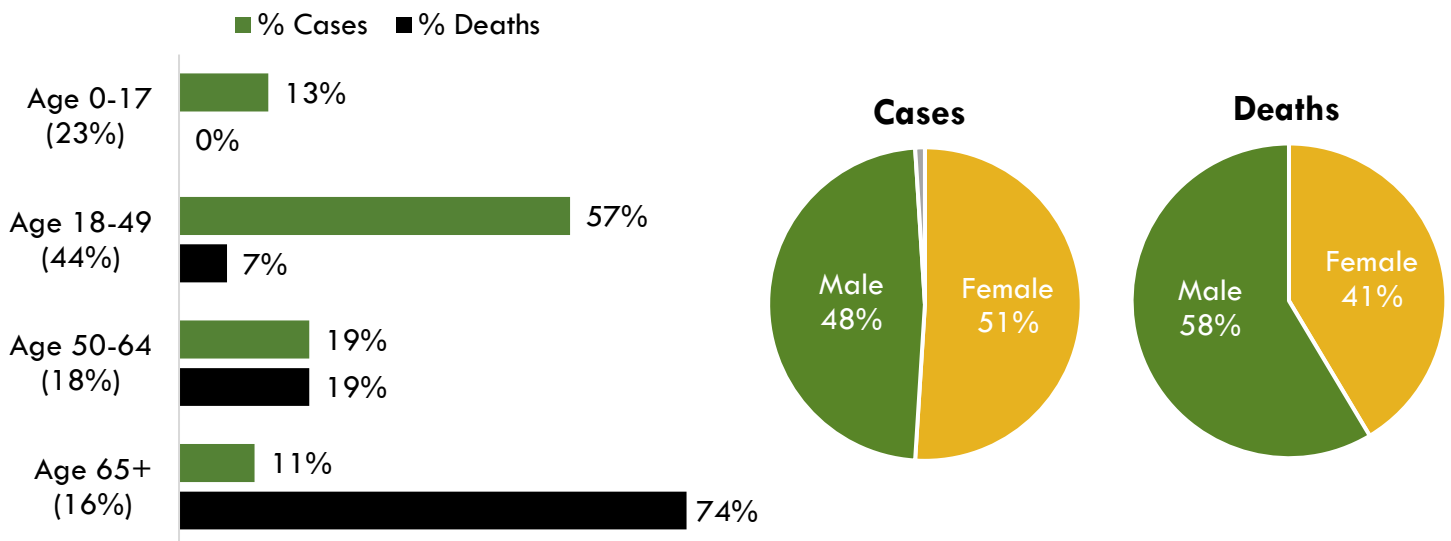

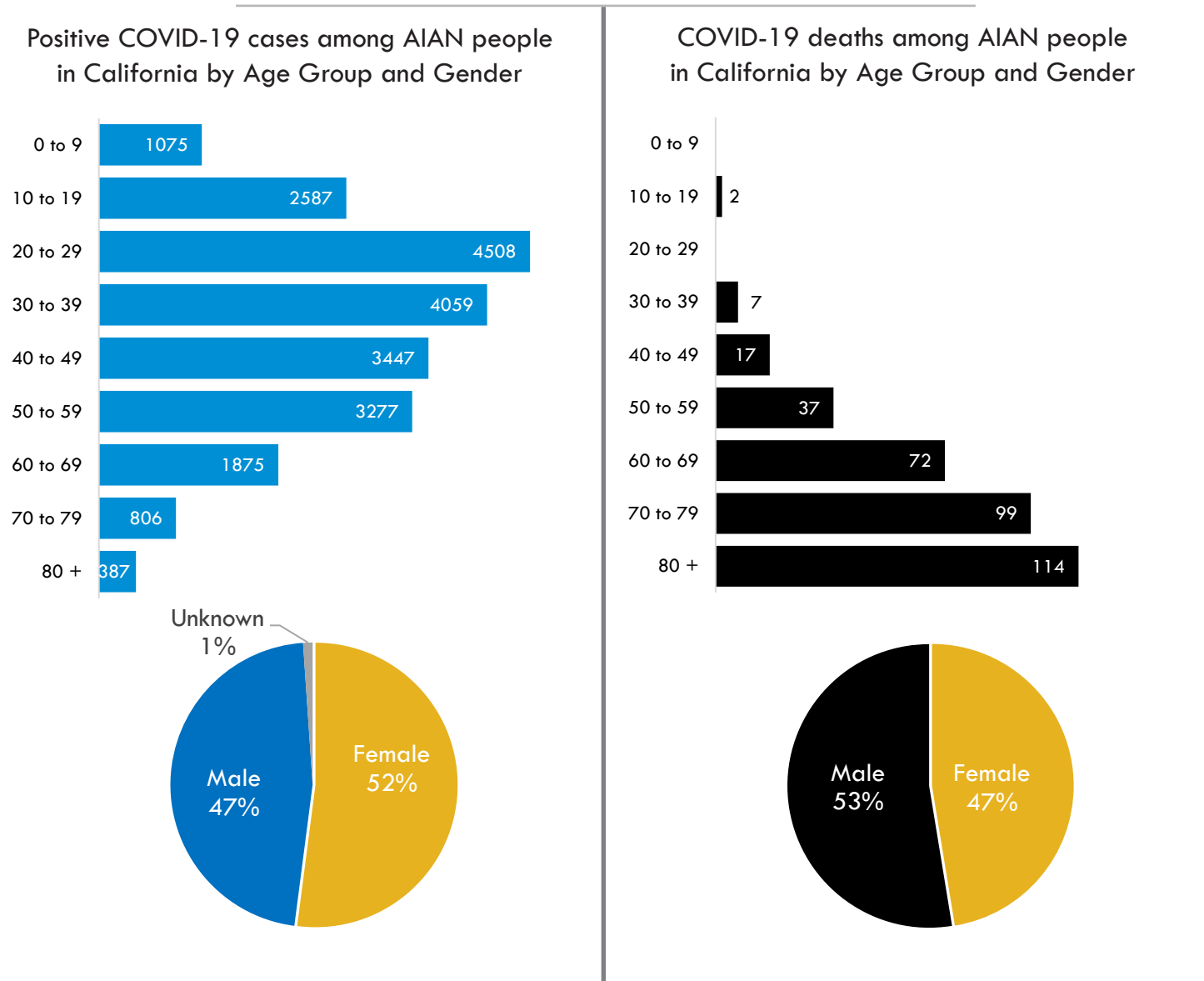

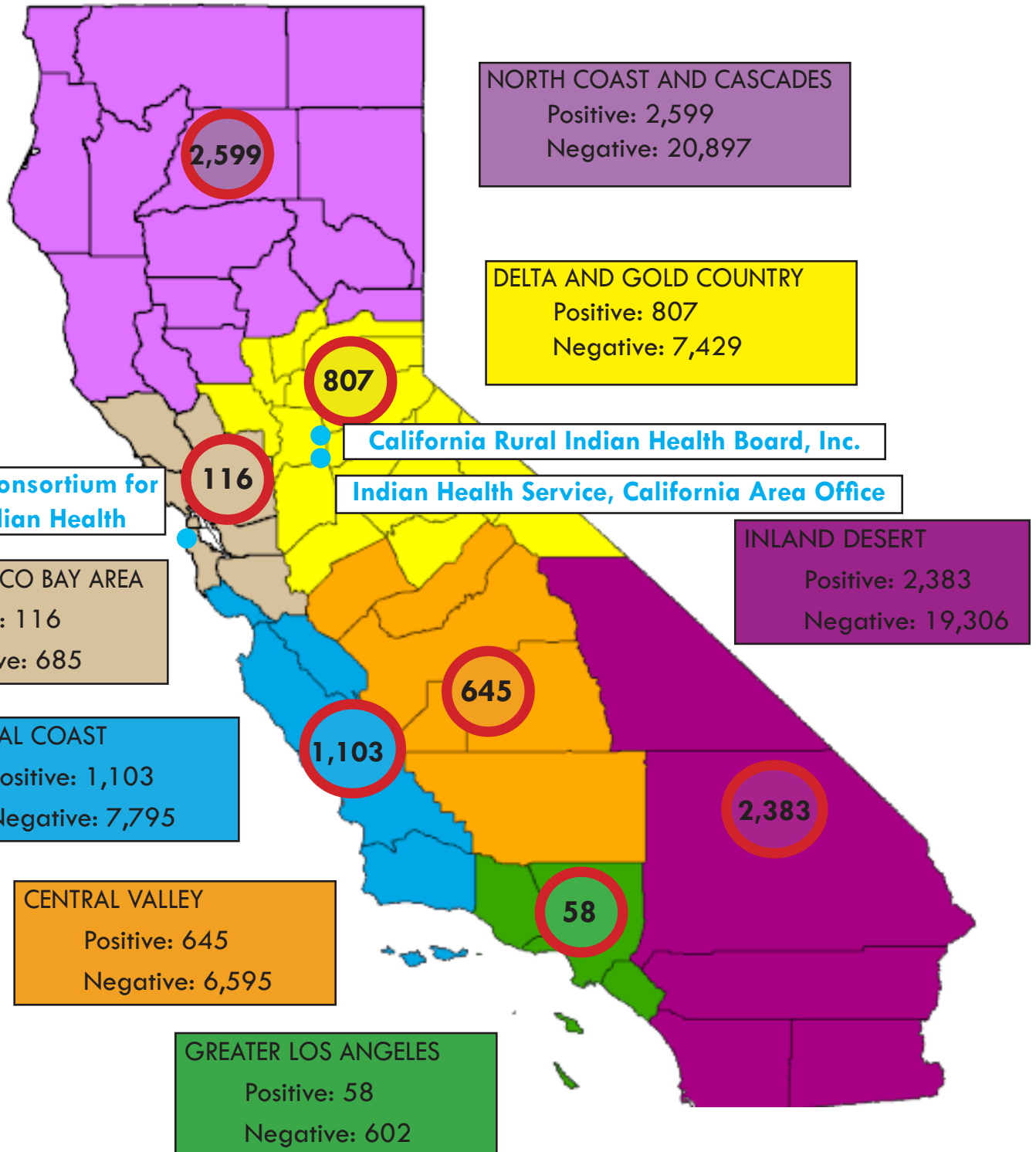

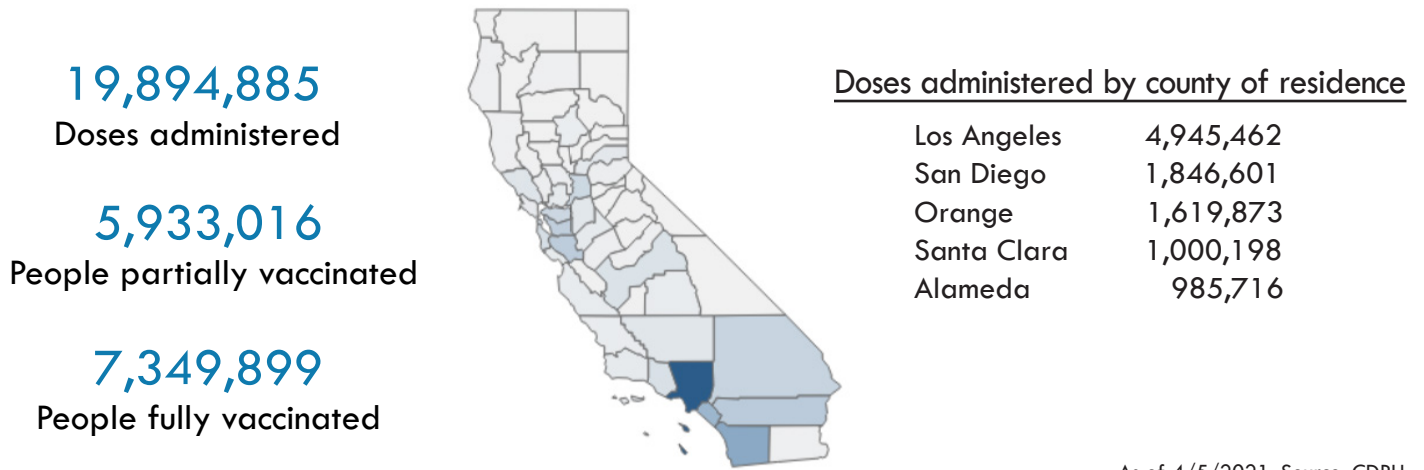


Number of positive cases identified by region

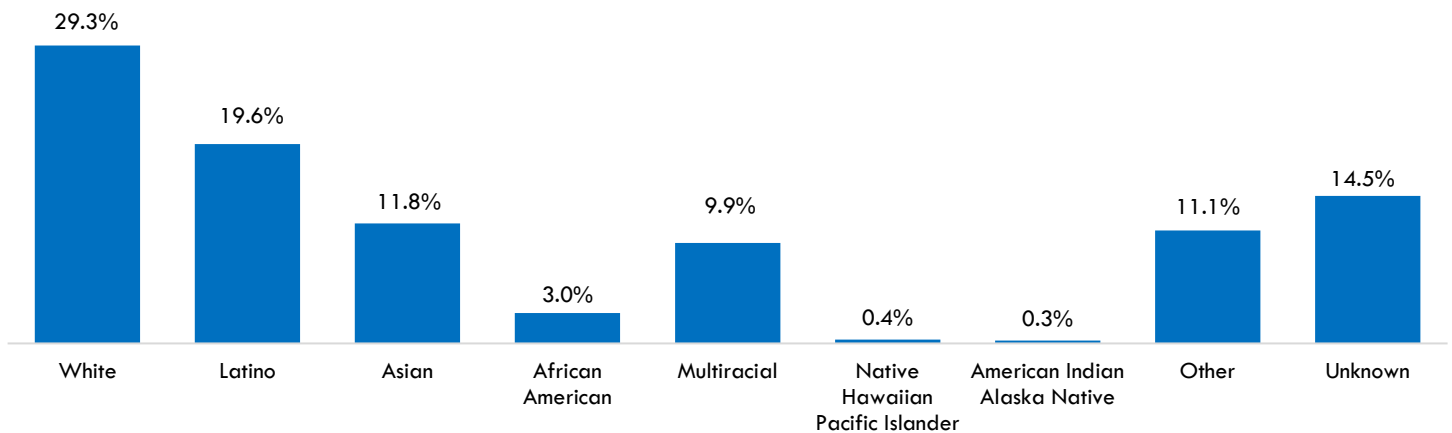

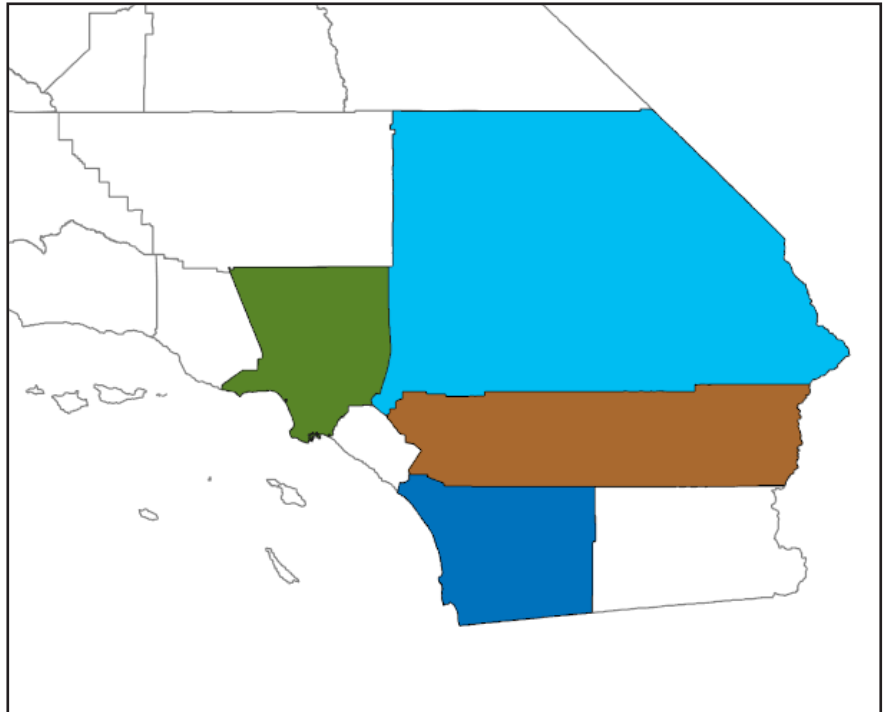

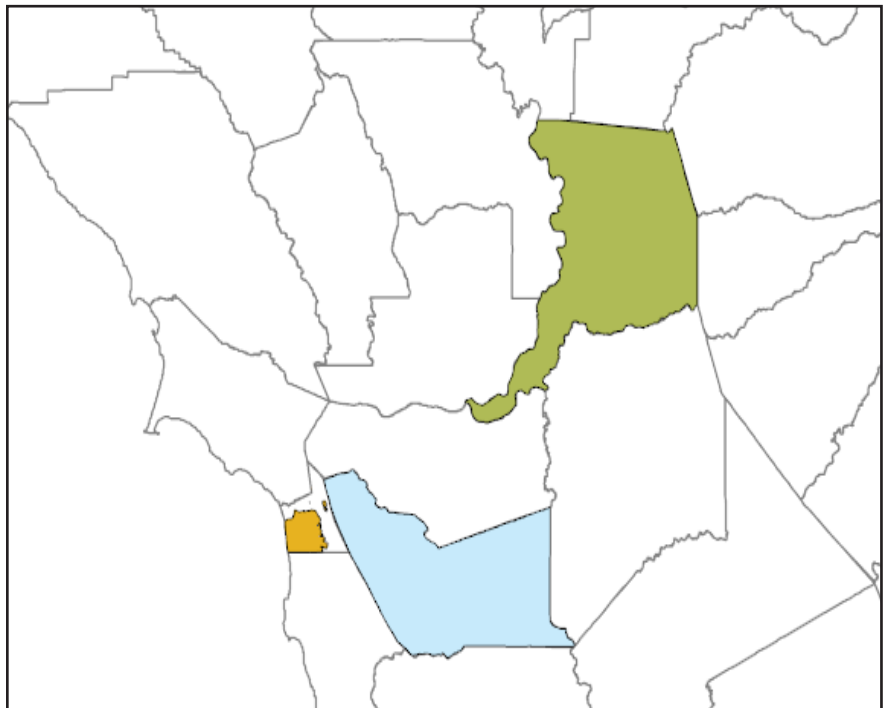

TRIBAL STATE OF EMERGENCY AND SHELTER IN PLACE DECLARATIONS



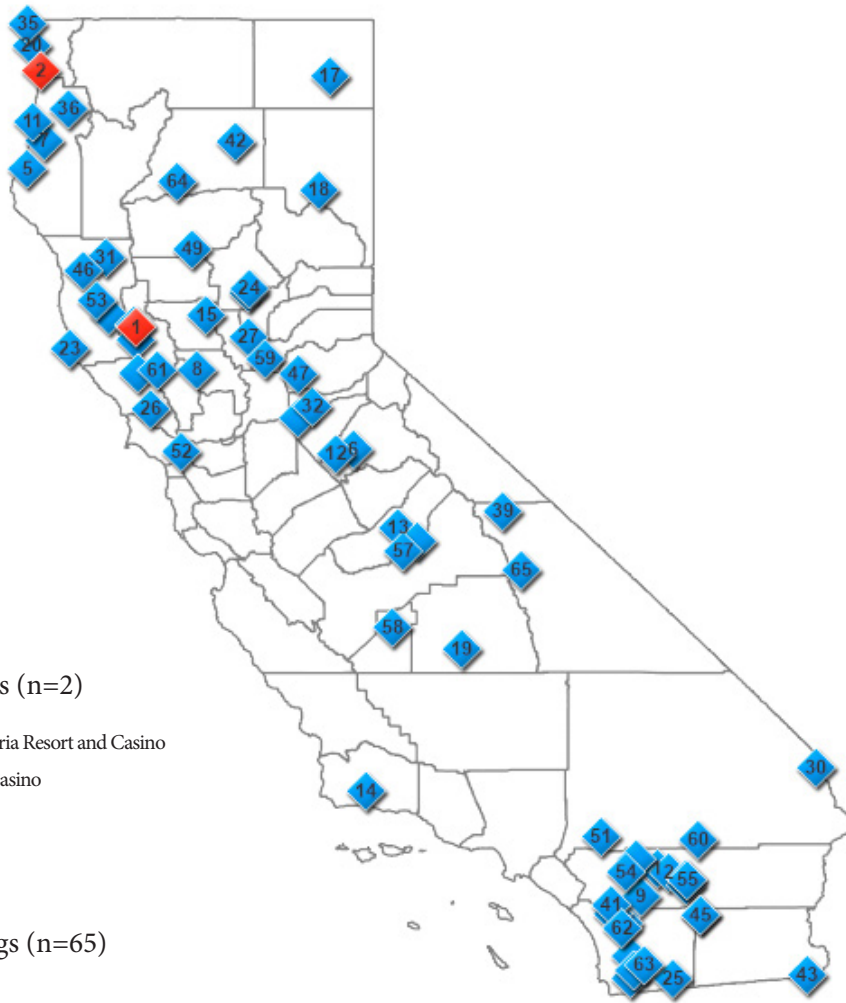
