

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATIONAL REPORT #272 APRIL 14, 2021



DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 136.9 million with more than 2.9 million deaths.

In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 31,158,087 and deaths at 560,576.

While the safety of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine is being reviewed by federal authorities, please immediately pause further use of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine. Additional information and recommendations will follow soon. California Department of Public Health will also urgently convene our own Western State's Scientific Advisory Committee to discuss the matter. Please see the full joint CDC and FDA statement HERE.

Data from 13 states indicate that compared with White persons, Hispanic and American Indian or Alaska Native persons experienced 1.7 times the rate for emergency department visits due to COVID-19 during October-December 2020. The full report is available HERE.

California aims to fully reopen June 15. The move forward comes as the state has reached 20 million vaccinations, including 4 million in its hardest-hit communities. Masking and vaccinations will continue. Hospitalization rates must stay low and vaccination availability high for the state to fully reopen. When California fully reopens the economy, the state will move beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Commonsense health measures such as masking will remain across the state. A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.


A probable case or death is defined by:

i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID19. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.




RISK FOR COVID-19 INFECTION, HOSPITALIZATION, & DEATH BY RACE/ETHNICITY, U.S.






New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date

Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California






















