DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 160 million with more than 3.3 million deaths.

In the United States as of May 12, the total number of cases stands at 32,608,287 and deaths at 580,073.

The total number of COVID-19 vaccinations administered in California has reached 30 million. See vaccination statistics statewide and broken down by county in their Vaccine Dashboard [HERE](#).

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration expanded the emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for the prevention of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) to include adolescents 12 through 15 years of age. The Indian Health Service also announced that facilities will now begin vaccinating youth, who are 12 years old and up, with the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. The IHS has ample supply of Pfizer vaccine and are working with IHS Area Offices and federal, Tribal, and urban sites to distribute the vaccine that has unique cold-chain requirements. COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance* (as of 5/12/21)

- Total cases: 32,608,287
- Total deaths: 580,073
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 55 (50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands)

*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.

A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

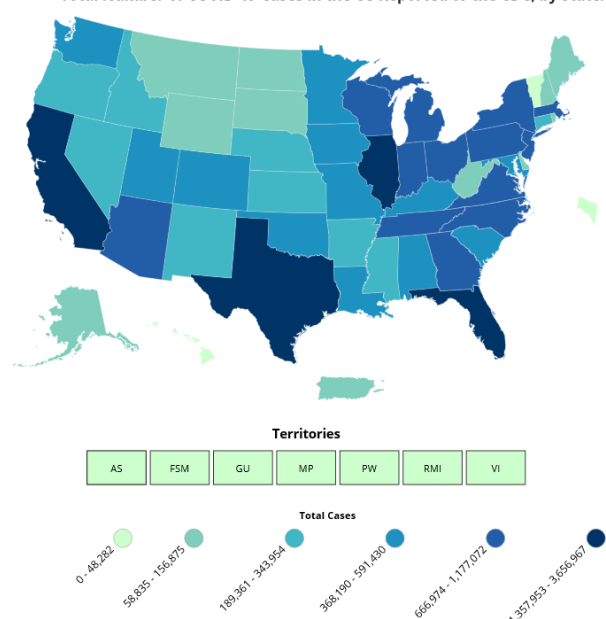
A probable case or death is defined by:

- i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19.
- State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

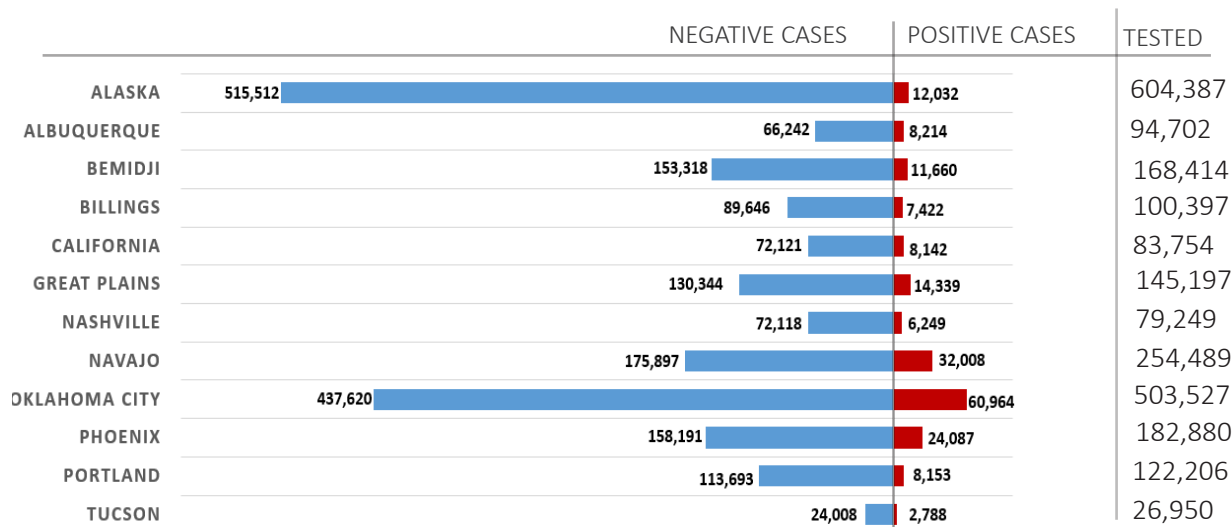


RISK FOR COVID-19 INFECTION, HOSPITALIZATION, & DEATH BY RACE/ETHNICITY, U.S.

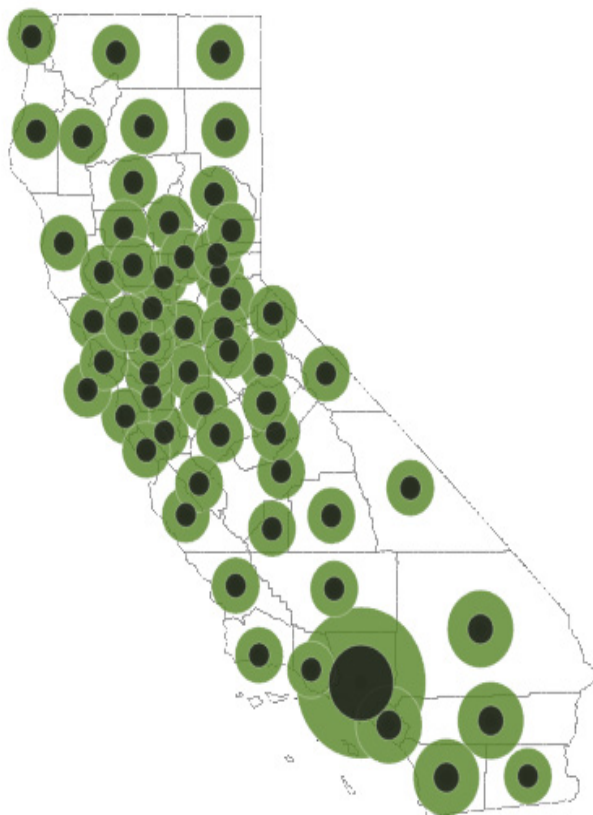

Of these, 8,142 patients have tested positive for COVID-19 and 72,121 have tested negative for COVID-19.

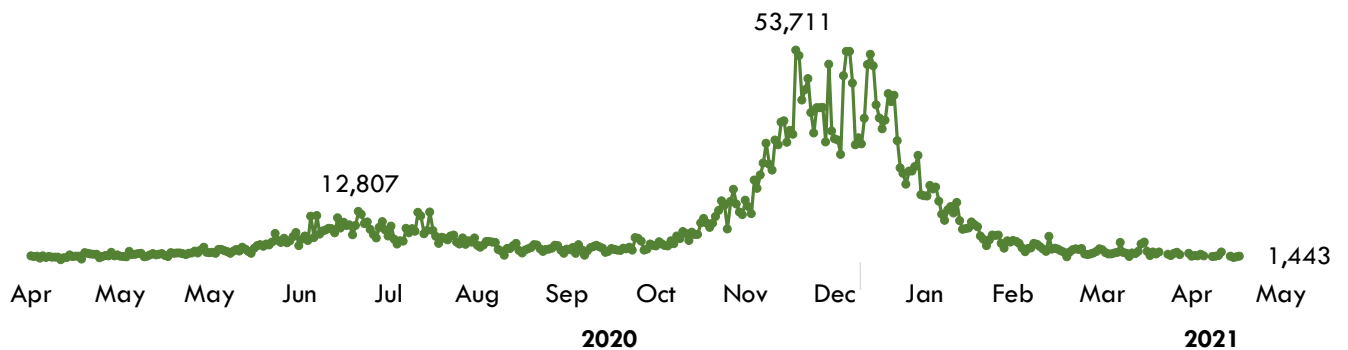

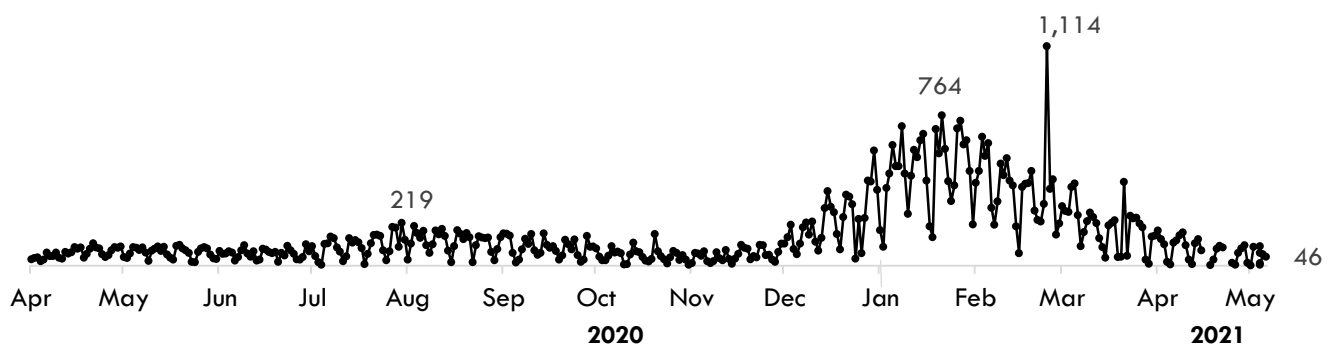

New Confirmed Cases in California by Date



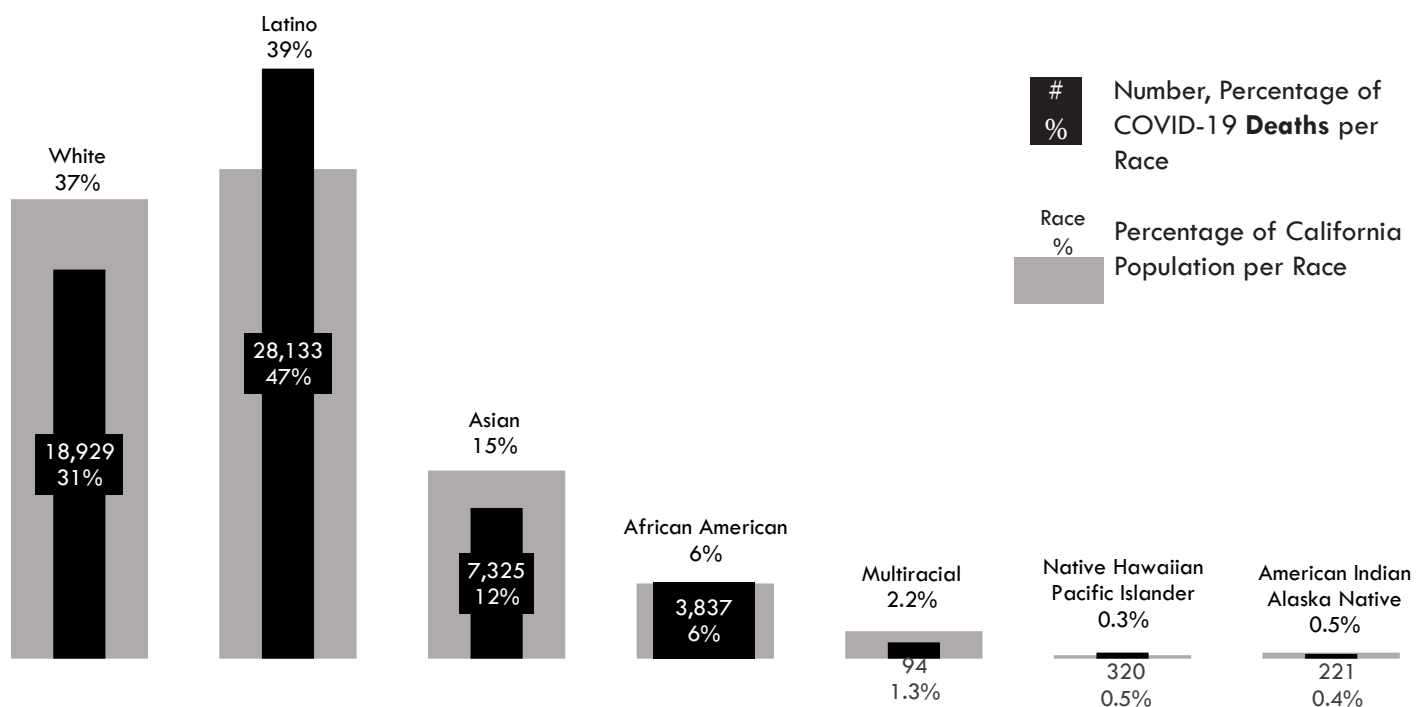
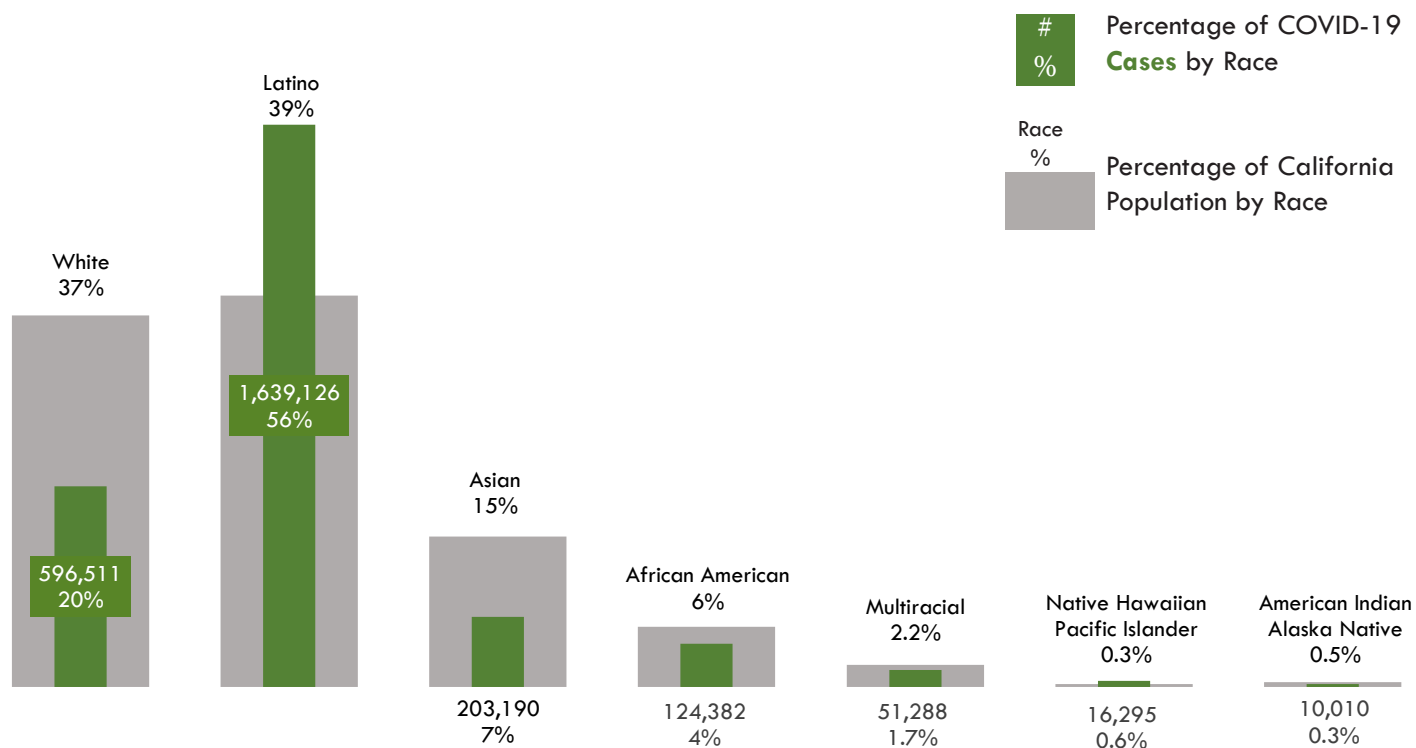
New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date

Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California

American Indians and Alaska Natives account for 0.5% percent of the population, **0.3% of COVID-19 cases**, and **0.3% of deaths** in California. This includes a total of **10,010 cases** and **221 deaths** among American Indian and Alaska Native people in California.

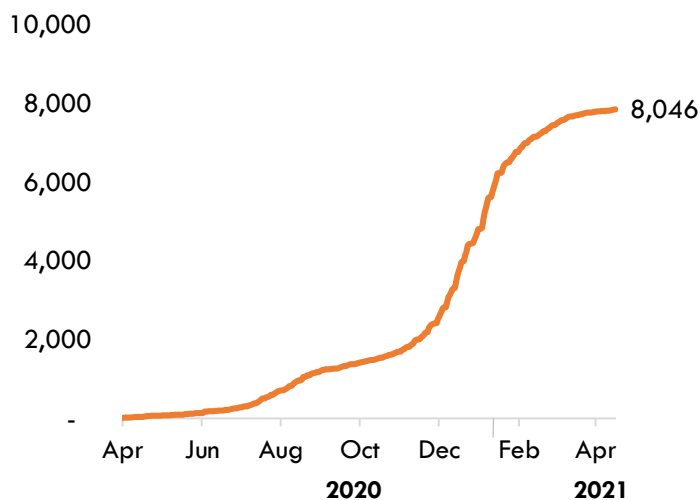

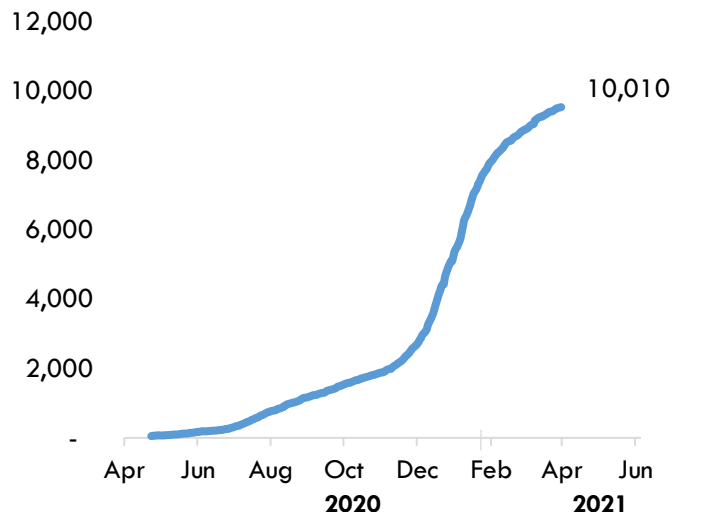

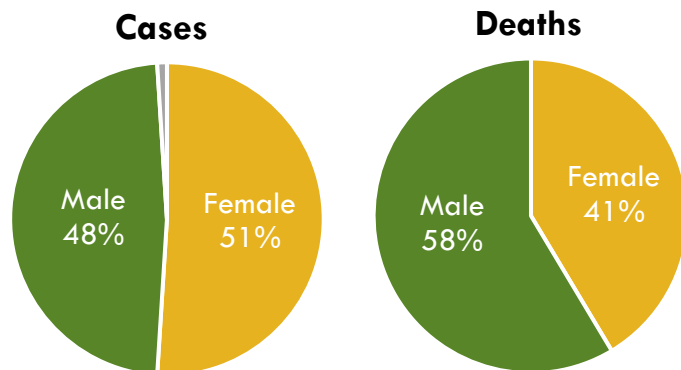
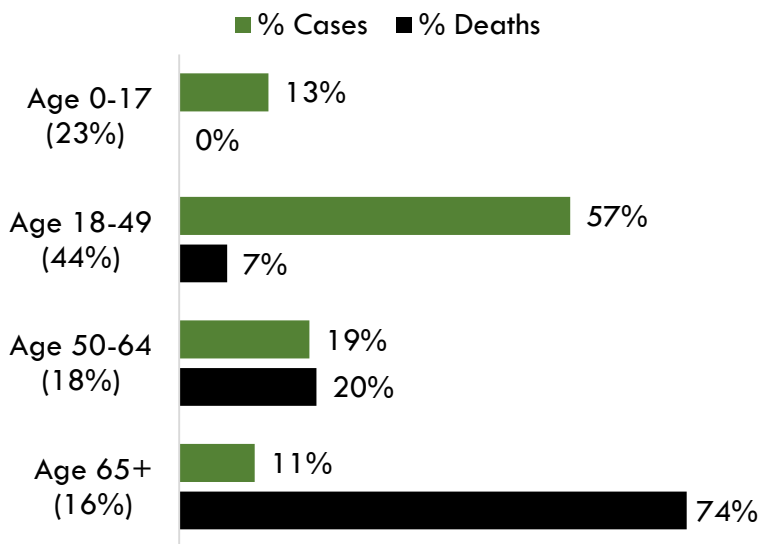

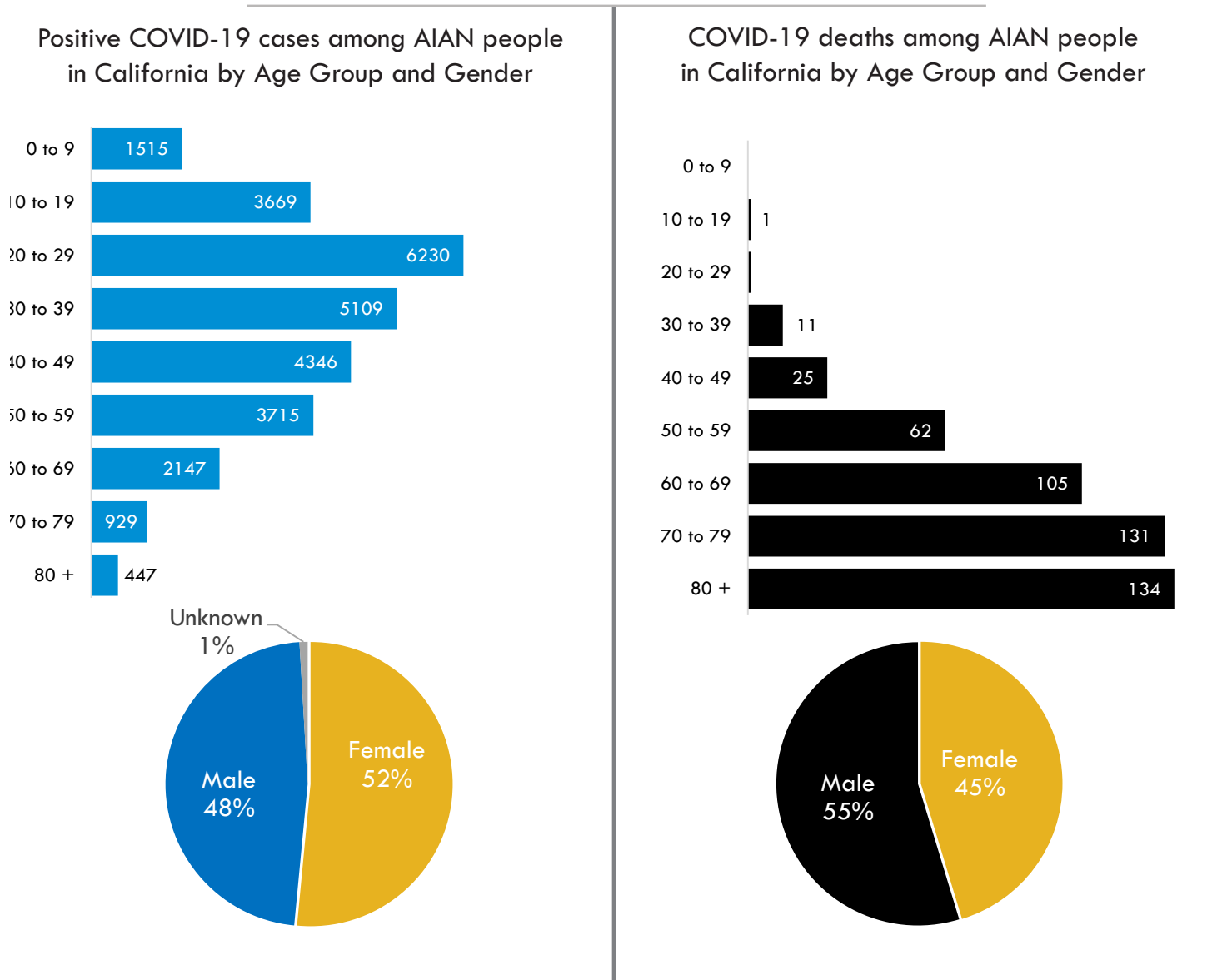

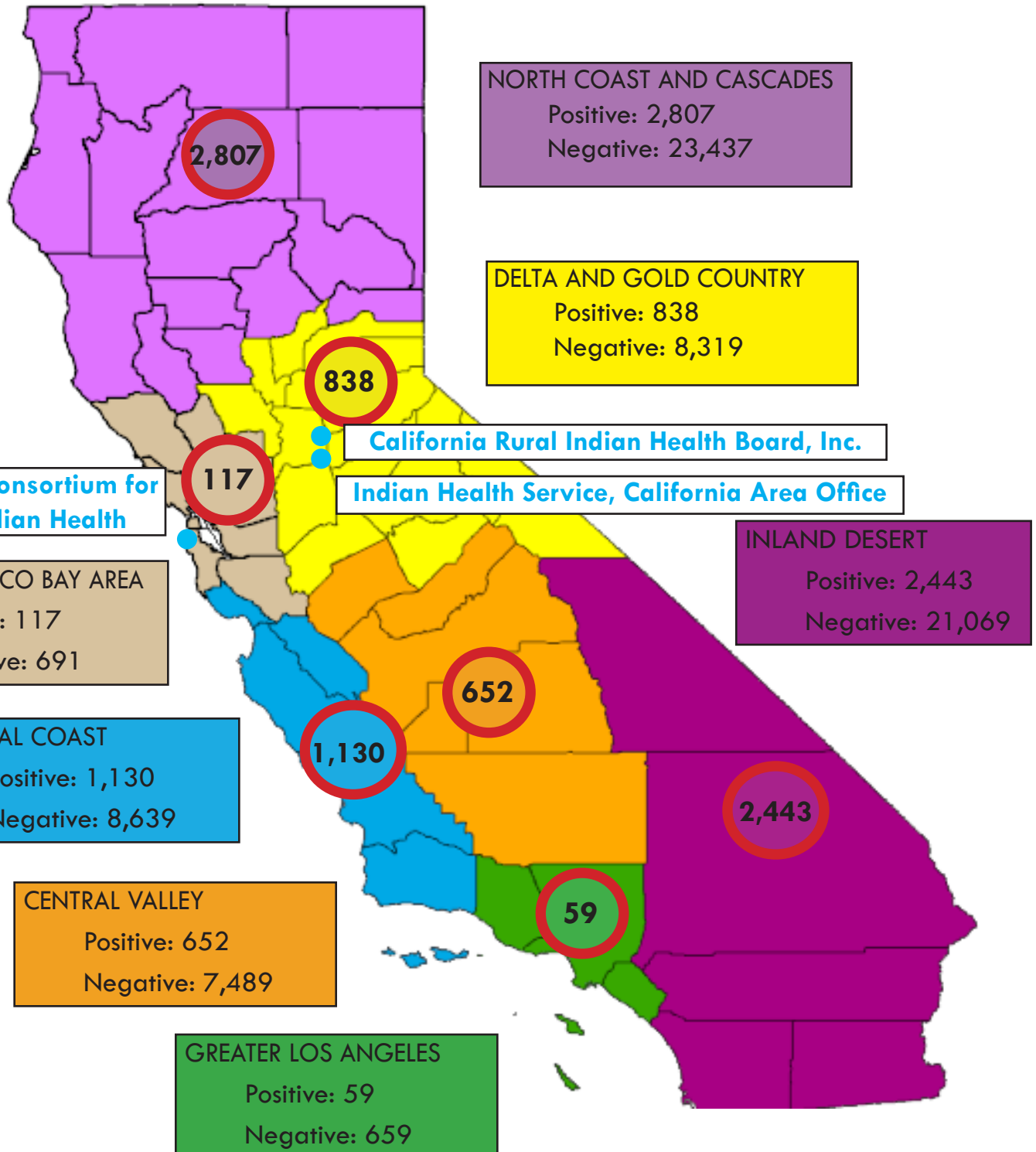

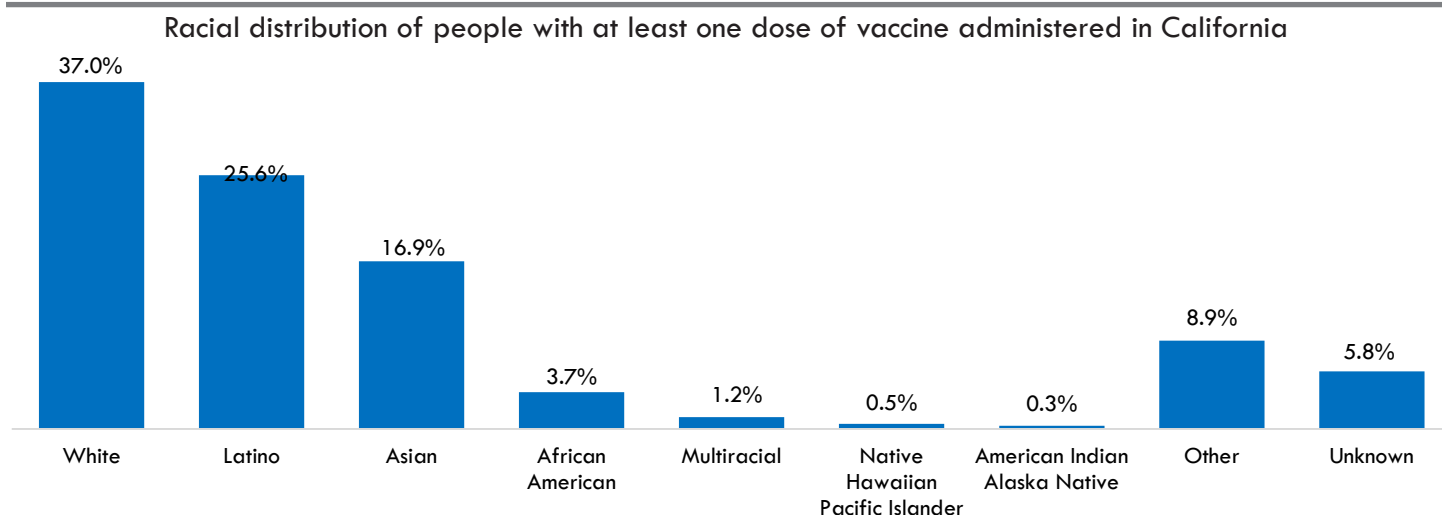
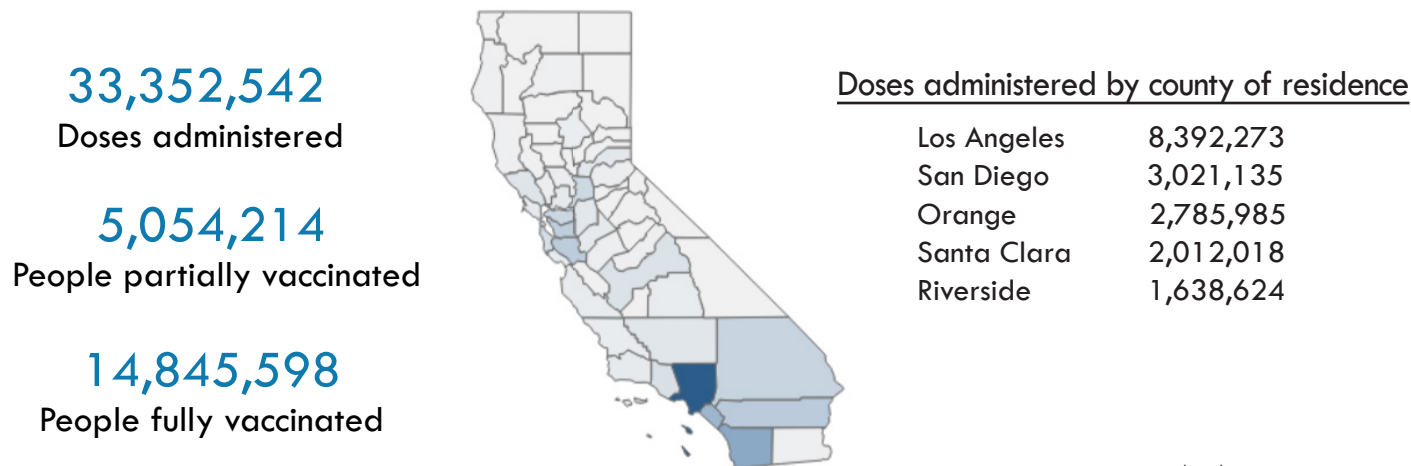


Number of positive cases identified by region

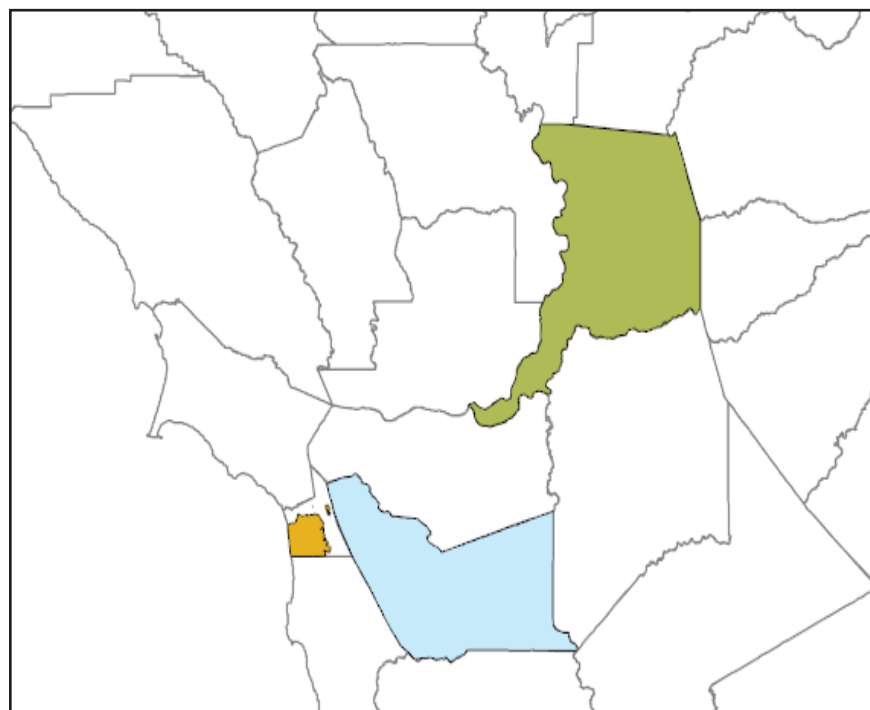

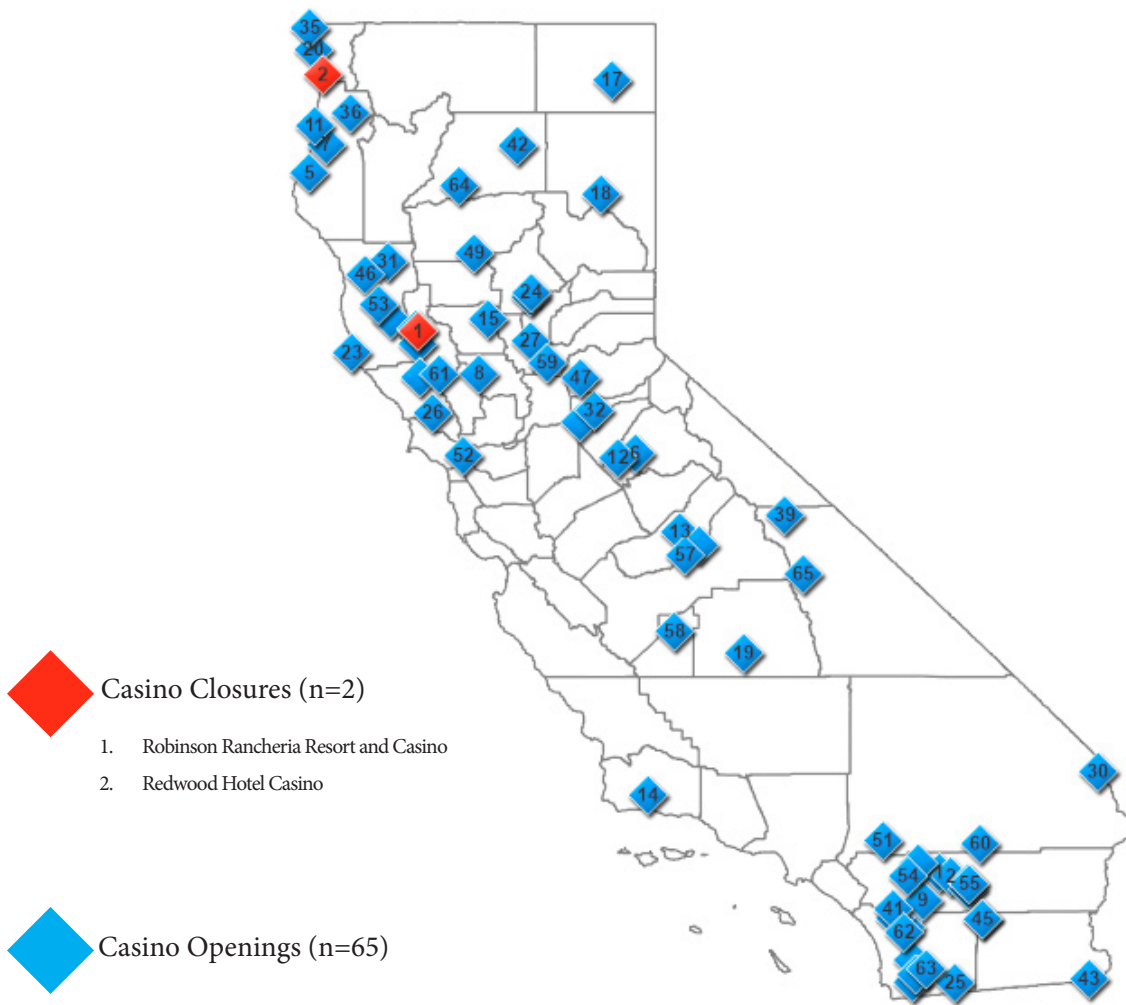
