

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATIONAL REPORT #303 JUNE 11, 2021



DAILY HIGHLIGHTS

Globally, COVID-19 cases have surpassed 174.5 million with more than 3.7 million deaths.

In the United States, the total number of cases stands at 33,246,578 and deaths at 596,059.

COVID-19 vaccination began in the United States in December 2020, and adults aged \geq 65 years were prioritized in early phases. By May 1, 2021, 82%, 63%, and 42% of adults aged \geq 65, 50–64, and 18–49 years, respectively, had received \geq 1 vaccine dose. From November 29–December 12, 2020 to April 18–May 1, 2021, the rate ratios of COVID-19 incidence, emergency department visits, hospital admissions, and deaths among adults aged \geq 65 years (\geq 70 years for hospitalizations) to adults aged 18–49 years declined 40%, 59%, 65%, and 66%, respectively. The greater decline in COVID-19 morbidity and mortality in older adults, the age group with the highest vaccination rates, demonstrates the potential impact of increasing population-level vaccination coverage. COVID-19 adolescent hospitalization rates from COVID-NET peaked at 2.1 per 100,000 in early January 2021, declined to 0.6 in mid-March, and rose to 1.3 in April. Among hospitalized adolescents, nearly one third required intensive care unit admission, and 5% required invasive mechanical ventilation; no associated deaths occurred. Recent increased hospitalization rates in spring 2021 and potential for severe disease reinforce the importance of continued COVID-19 prevention measures, including vaccination and correct and consistent mask wearing among persons not fully vaccinated or when required. COVID-19: U.S. at a Glance*

- Total cases: 33,246,578
- Total deaths: 596,059

*As of April 14, 2020, CDC case counts and death counts include both confirmed and probable cases and deaths. This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020.


A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19.

A probable case or death is defined by:

i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID19. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.




RISK FOR COVID-19 INFECTION, HOSPITALIZATION, & DEATH BY RACE/ETHNICITY, U.S.






New Confirmed Deaths in California by Date





Racial distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths in California















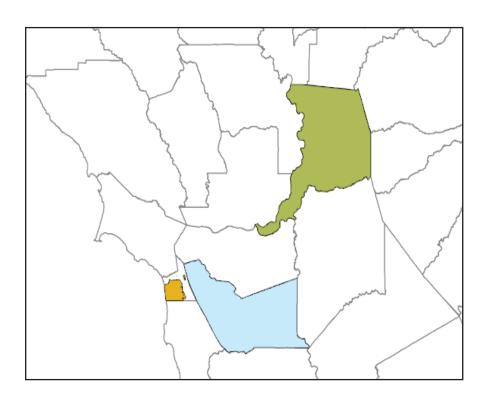
